



The Planning Department is proposing design regulations and review/approval requirements for multiple residential structures on a single lot, which includes the type of development commonly called "site condos." The section is titled "Multiple Residential Structures on a Single Lot."

The proposed regulations focus on the review and approval process of development projects and on site design standards, and address streets, landscaping, open space, pedestrian facilities, distance between buildings, and buffering. The design of the structures in the development would be required to meet the applicable structure type standards in other parts of section 21.07.110.
