# Petition Information

The initiative and referendum procedures appear in the Municipal Charter under Section 3.02 and Municipal Code Section 2.50.

The 2009 Mayoral Election established the current number of qualified voters required to file a petition for initiative or referendum at 5,871.

## **Basic Steps of a Petition**

### **Petition Application**

1. Provide a Primary sponsor and an Alternate petition sponsor.
2. Prepare petition language.
3. Collect signatures of 10 qualified municipal voters who agree to act as sponsors.
4. Submit petition application to the Municipal Clerk.

### **Petition Application Review**

1. Municipal Attorney reviews petition language for legal sufficiency, or lack thereof.
2. Municipal Clerk verifies the sponsors are qualified municipal voters.
3. Petition Primary sponsor is notified if petition application is certified.
4. If petition application is not certified, Primary sponsor is notified and provided with the Municipal Attorney's memorandum.

### **Petition Circulation**

1. Municipal Clerk prepares master template, legal size paper 8 1/2" x 14", to be used to gather signatures. The Municipal Clerk shall not be responsible for reproducing copies of the master form.
2. Petition sponsors circulate petition. Petition signatures must be secured within 90 days from the date of first actual circulation.
3. Petition Primary sponsor submits petition signatures to Municipal Clerk.
4. Municipal Clerk verifies the signatures to determine if signers are qualified municipal voters.
5. Primary sponsor is notified if the petition meets the number of qualified municipal voters, or lack thereof.
6. If there are insufficient signatures to certify the petition, the sponsors will have 10 days from the date the Municipal Clerk mails the notification to the Primary sponsor to provide the Municipal Clerk with clear and convincing evidence that signatures not counted were in fact signatures of qualified voters.

# Anchorage, Alaska, Code of Ordinances

## Article III. - Powers

### ARTICLE III. - POWERS

Section 3.01. - Powers of the municipality.

Section 3.02. - Initiative and referendum.

Section 3.03. - Recall.

#### **Section 3.01. - Powers of the municipality.**

The municipality may exercise all legislative powers not prohibited by law or by this Charter.

**Editor's note**— The charter commission's commentary on this section is printed following the Charter as section 3.01 of such commentary.

#### **Section 3.02. - Initiative and referendum.**

**(a)**The powers of initiative and referendum are reserved for exercise by the people of Anchorage in the manner provided by law. The powers of initiative and referendum do not apply to ordinances establishing budgets, fixing mill levies, authorizing the issuance of bonds, or appropriating funds. A petition for initiative or referendum shall be signed by a number of qualified voters equal to at least ten percent of the voters who cast ballots at the last regular mayoral election.

**(b)**Within ten days from the filing of a petition for initiative or referendum, the municipal clerk shall certify on the petition whether or not it is sufficient. An initiative shall be submitted to the voters at the next regular election held at least 45 days after certification of the petition. A referendum shall be submitted to the voters at a regular or special election held not later than 75 days after certification of the petition. However, the assembly may submit a referendum to the voters at a later regular or special election if the assembly suspends the ordinance until the election.

**(c)**A referendum petition may be filed at any time. However, filing of a referendum petition suspends the ordinance or resolution if and only if the petition is filed within 60 days after the effective date of the ordinance or resolution. The suspension terminates on a finding of insufficiency of the petition or upon certification of a majority vote against repeal.

**(d)**An initiative petition is void if the assembly enacts substantially the same measure prior to the election. A referendum petition is void if the assembly repeals the ordinance in question prior to the election.

**(e)**The assembly may not repeal or substantially alter an ordinance enacted by initiative or enacted under (d) above, or re-enact a measure rejected by referendum within two years after certification of the election at which the enactment or rejection occurred.

#### **Section 3.03. - Recall.**

An elected official may be recalled by the voters in the manner provided by law. A petition to place the recall of an elected official before the voters shall be signed by a number of qualified voters as required by law.

2.50.010 - Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

*Initiative* means a ballot proposition presented to the voters after submission of petitions signed by a specified number of qualified voters, to determine whether an ordinance or resolution shall be enacted directly by popular vote.

*Municipal clerk* means the Anchorage municipal clerk.

*Petition* means a written petition bearing the signatures of qualified voters seeking submission of an initiative or referendum measure to the electorate.

*Qualified voter* means a person who, at the moment he signs a petition for initiative or referendum, is legally entitled to vote and who, by virtue of a current, valid residence address, is registered to vote in state and Anchorage municipal elections.

*Referendum* means a ballot proposition presented to the voters after submission of petitions signed by a specified number of qualified voters to determine whether an ordinance or resolution already approved shall be repealed by popular vote.

### **2.50.020 - Application for a petition.**

**A. Application.** An initiative or referendum may only be proposed by first filing an application for a petition on a form, which shall be prescribed and provided by the municipal clerk.

**B. Form and content.** The application shall contain:

- 1.** The name, residence and mailing address, signature and date of signature of two resident citizens who have not been convicted of a felony and who are the primary and alternate contact persons to whom all correspondence relating to the petition may be sent. The two contact persons shall be considered sponsors;
- 2.** The name, residence and mailing address, signature and date of signature of at least ten qualified voters not including the contact persons who will sponsor the petition. Additional qualified sponsors may be added not less than three days before the date of first circulation of the petition certified by the clerk;
- 3.** The petition proposed to be circulated. The proposed petition shall be submitted on the form provided by the municipal clerk in the application packet. The proposed petition shall:
  - a.** set out verbatim the ordinance or resolution sought to be enacted or repealed by the petition;
  - b.** have the required names, residence and mailing addresses, signatures, and dates of signatures of the initial contact persons and sponsors;
  - c.** meet constitutional, charter and other legal requirements or restrictions;
  - d.** include only a single subject; and
  - e.** be enforceable as a matter of law or be clearly denominated as advisory only.

### **2.50.030 - Certification of application.**

**A. Legal review of application.** Upon receipt of a completed application for a petition the municipal clerk shall immediately remit a copy of the application to the municipal attorney for review. Within ten business days after receiving a completed application, the municipal clerk shall verify the sponsors' qualifications and, after consultation with the municipal attorney, determine and certify the legal sufficiency, or lack thereof, of the application and the proposed initiative or referendum.

**B. Master form of petition.** Upon certification of the application, the municipal clerk shall provide a master form of the petition to the primary contact person. Only unaltered photocopies of this master form may be used to gather signatures. The municipal clerk shall not be responsible for reproducing copies of this master form. The master form of the petition shall state:

- 1.the date of first actual circulation of the petition as designated by the municipal clerk; and
- 2.that the signatures on the petition must be secured within 90 days from the date of first actual circulation.

*C.Appeal of application certification.* A decision by the municipal clerk on an application for a petition is subject to judicial review by direct appeal to the Superior Court of the State of Alaska. Failure to appeal the municipal clerk's decision within 30 days from the date the municipal clerk distributes its decision shall constitute a waiver of the right of appeal.

#### **2.50.040 - Required signatures on petition.**

**A.**A petition shall be signed by a number of qualified voters as provided in Charter Section 3.02. Only one signature may be counted for each qualified voter on a petition.

**B.**The necessary signatures on a petition shall be secured within 90 days from the date of first actual circulation of the petition.

**C.**Only those signatures of qualified voters, as defined in section 2.50.010, shall be counted.

**D.**No signature shall be counted unless:

**1.**it is dated;

**2.**it is accompanied by the residence address of the qualified voter;

**3.**it is legible;

**4.**the last name of the signor is the same as that of a registered voter on the state voter registration rolls. For purposes of this subsection, if the signor has registered to vote with a hyphenated last name, but signs only the second part of the hyphenated name, the last name of the signor shall be considered the same as the registered voter;

**5.**the first name of the signor is the same or similar to that of the registered voter as identified in subsection 4. For purposes of this subsection, similar refers to a common or shortened form of a proper name or initials used in the place of a proper name;

**6.**the middle name or initial is not inconsistent with the middle name or initial of the registered voter as identified in subsections 4 and 5; and

**7.**the signor's address is the same or similar to that of the registered voter identified in subsections 4, 5 and 6. For the purpose of this subsection, similar refers to the use of common abbreviations or numeric symbols in the place of written out words.

**E.**Notwithstanding the provisions of 2.50.040D.3.—7., a signature shall be counted by the municipal clerk if the signer's qualifications can be ascertained from the state voter registration rolls on the basis of other information available in the petition, such as date of birth, social security number, or voter identification number.

**F.**For the purposes of this section, there is a rebuttable presumption that a signor who is a registered voter on the date signatures are counted by the municipal clerk was a registered voter at the moment of signing the petition.

**G.**Any person who signs a petition may withdraw his signature upon written application to the municipal clerk within seven days after the petition has been filed with the municipal clerk.

#### **2.50.050 - Certification of petition after signatures.**

**A.**Each petition shall be filed with the municipal clerk as a single instrument and shall be certified as provided in section 3.02(b) of the Charter. Once the petition is filed with the municipal clerk it may not be supplemented.

**B.**Signatures rejected by the municipal clerk shall be categorized by the subsections under which they were rejected. If there are insufficient signatures to certify the petition, the sponsors will have ten days from the date the municipal clerk mails notification to the primary contact to provide the municipal clerk with clear and convincing evidence that signatures not counted pursuant to 2.50.040D.3.—7. were in fact signatures of qualified voters, as defined in section 2.50.010

**C.**Persons filing a petition with the municipal clerk proposing an initiative ballot proposition or referendum, may file simultaneously with the filing of the petition, a separate "Summary Statement" setting forth a recommended summary of the proposition required by section 28.40.040, provided, however, the clerk shall not be bound to utilize such recommended summary statement.

**D.**A decision by the municipal clerk on the number and sufficiency of signatures on a petition is subject to judicial review by direct appeal to the Superior Court of the State of Alaska. Failure to appeal the municipal clerk's decision within 30 days from the date of the municipal clerk's decision shall constitute a waiver of the right of appeal.

#### **2.50.055 - Summary of economic effects.**

**A.**

As early as reasonably possible after passage of an assembly initiated referendum and after final certification of an initiative or voter initiated referendum pursuant to Charter section 3.02(b), the office of management and budget shall prepare a summary of economic effects of each initiative or referendum conforming to the requirements of section 2.30.050, provided however, that such summary of economic effects shall comply with the provisions of section 1.15.025I.

**1.** Notwithstanding the provisions of 2.30.050, the summary of economic effects required by this section shall be in a format readily understood by a voter of average capacity and intelligence and shall use short, direct sentences and simple language of common understanding.

**B.** Whenever possible, the municipal clerk shall publish the summary of economic effects required by subsection A. of this section in the notices of election required by chapter 28.20 next to the ballot issue to which it relates. In the event that it is not possible to publish the summary of economic effects with a notice of election, the municipal clerk shall publish the ballot proposition with its summary of economic effects in a special notice thereof which conforms to the requirements of chapter 28.20 to the extent reasonably possible.

**2.50.090 - Effect of vote.**

**A.** If a majority of those voting favor the initiative proposal, it becomes effective upon certification of the election results. If a majority of those voting favor repeal of the legislation referred, that legislation is repealed upon certification of the election.

**B.** Where voters have approved at the election initiative or referendum petitions which, because of substantial legal conflicts, cannot stand together, the municipal clerk shall certify to the assembly only that proposition receiving the highest majority vote of votes actually cast. A decision of the municipal clerk pursuant to this subsection may be appealed to the superior court.

C. An unsuccessful initiative referendum precludes the filing of a new petition for the same purpose sooner than six months after voter disapproval of the initiative or referendum.
