57 (MEA), ENSTAR and Chugach Electric working cooperatively to address a possible natural gas shortage, a loss of
58 power during below zero temperatures, an emergency plan, a risk management plan and the Community and
59 Economic Development Committee addressing the energy issue.

Ms. Gray-Jackson reported on Office of Management and Budget Director Cheryl Frasca's address of the budget,
receiving a legal opinion, a resolution for Assembly consideration and public process. Dr. Selkregg, Mr. Claman,
Municipal Attorney Dennis Wheeler and Mr. Coffey addressed the August 27th budget worksession, proposed budget
cuts, the Assembly's role in the process, a legal response and Mayor Sullivan reporting to the Assembly.

2 Mr. Flynn reported that the Anchorage Convention and Visitors Bureau held a Southcentral Alaska Tourist Summit the
3 previous week to address the 2010 forecast of 120,000 fewer cruise ship tourists to Southcentral Alaska, which would
4 have a significant financial impact to Anchorage. Tourist summits were also being held in Juneau and Fairbanks.

6 Ms. Johnston reported the Budget and Finance Committee had proposed an Assembly Information Memorandum
7 addressing budget changes. She reported the Municipal League Summer Meeting was held in the Mat-Su Valley to
8 address community issues with Governor Parnell and Senator Begich.

10 Ms. Drummond reported that the Spenard Hill would be closed for road repairs beginning on Thursday, August 27th.

12 Mr. Birch reported the recent Anchorage Chamber Board Meeting had included presentations on the Outer Continental
13 Shelf oil development, an economic update and the importance of resource development.

15 Mr. Gutierrez reported the next Public Safety Committee Meeting would be held at noon on September 9th at City Hall
16 to discuss homelessness and public inebriates.

18 Dr. Selkregg reported the Community and Economic Development Committee's new subcommittee would review
