

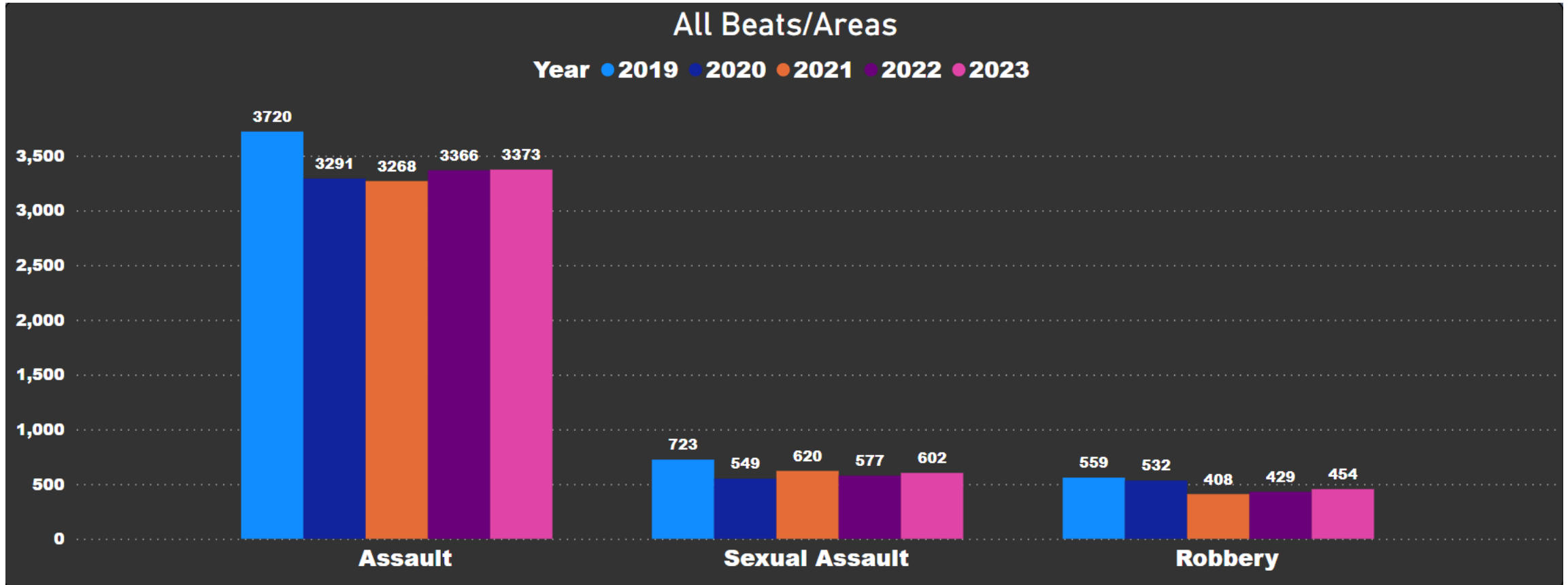

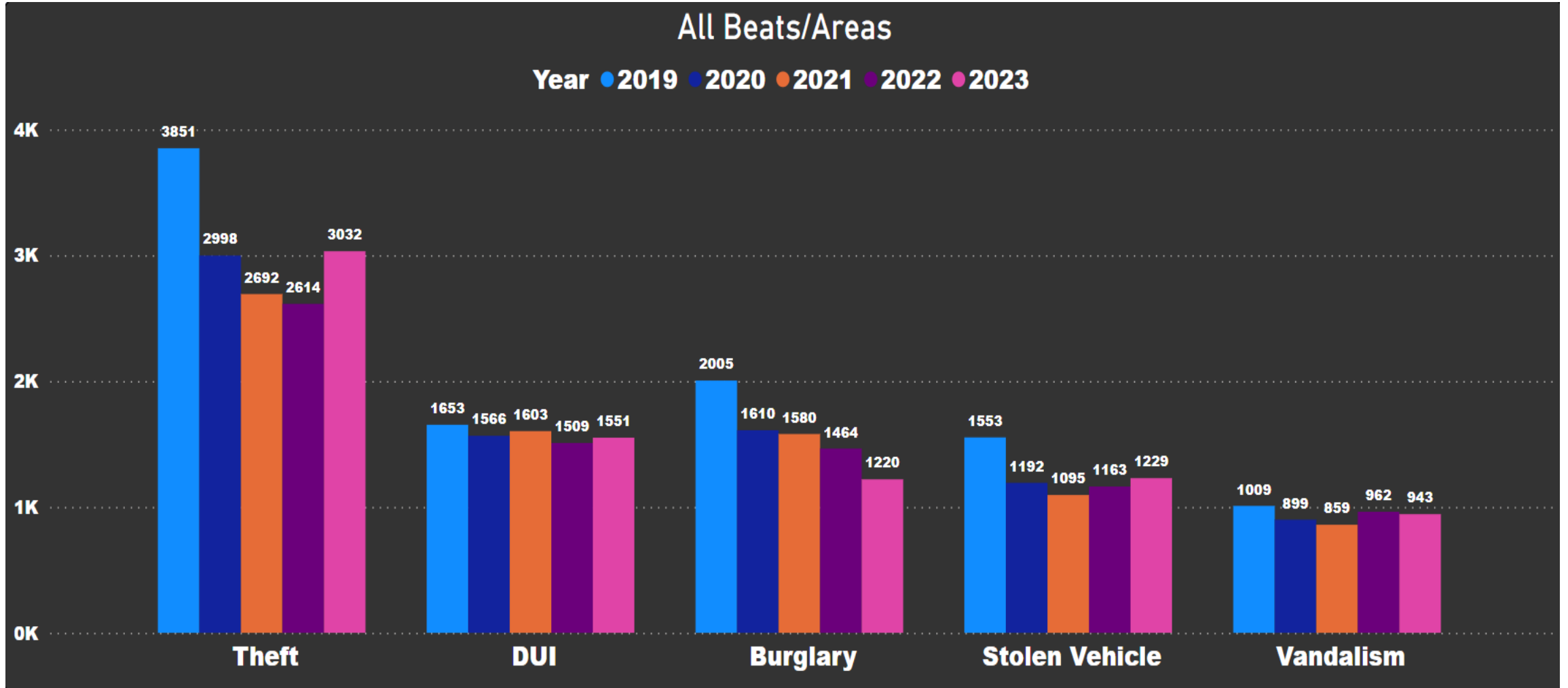

Property & DUI Calls For Service 2019-2023

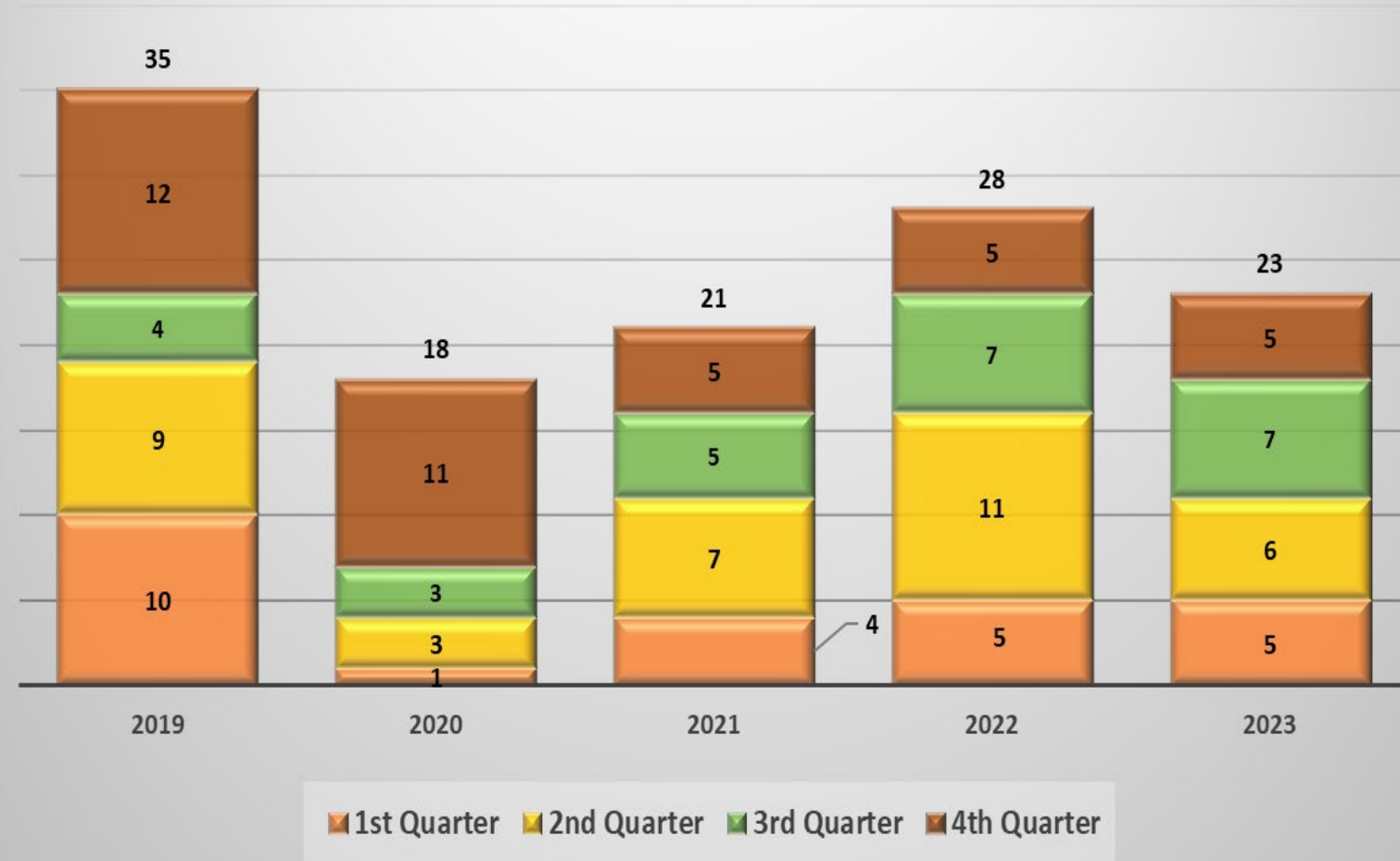


Anchorage Homicide Victims 2019-2023

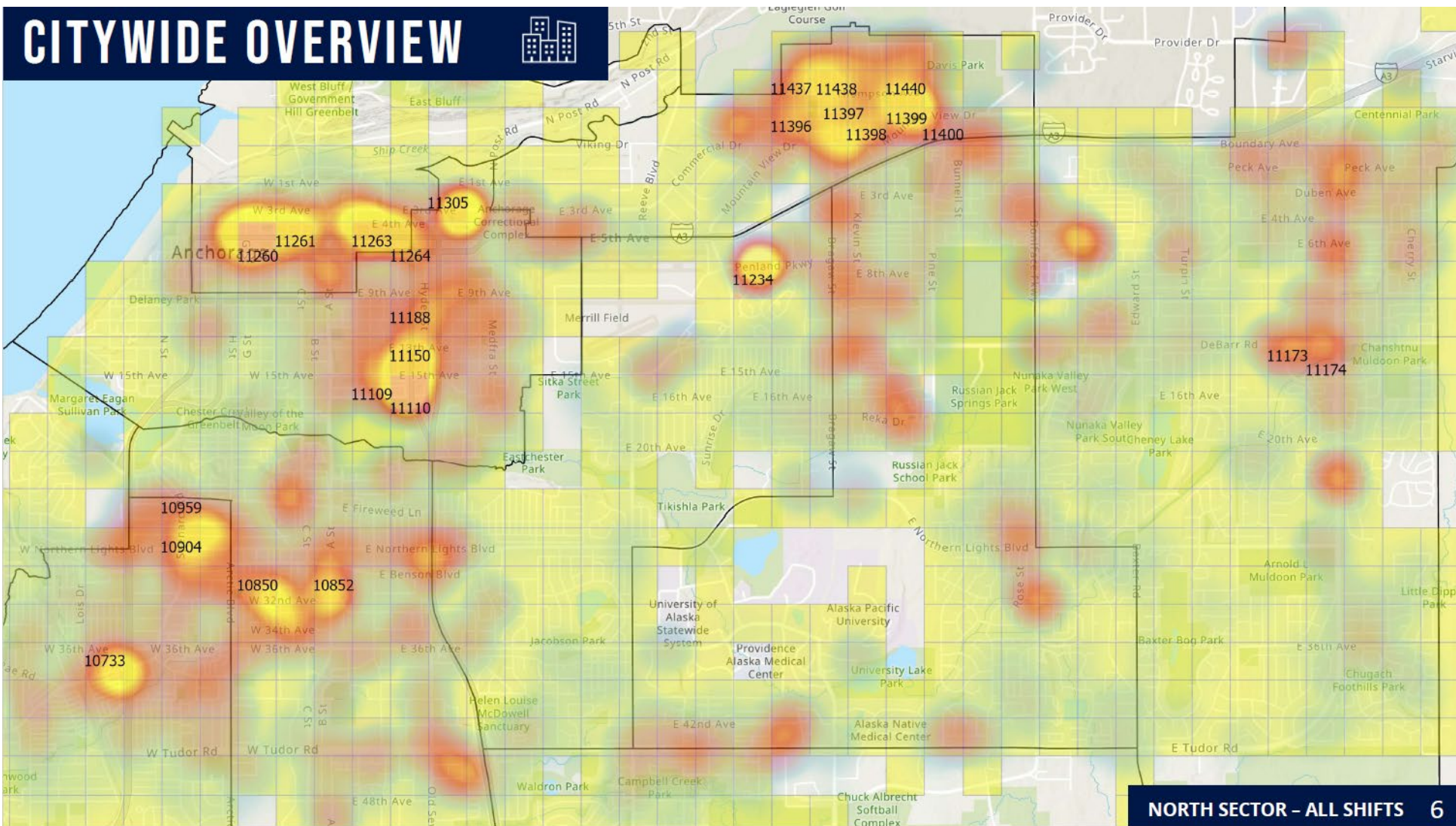


What are we doing?

- Hotspot Policing: Use data to allocate resources
 - Use heat maps for suppression details and directed assignments
- CPTED (Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design)
- Drug Unit Emphasis: Partnership with State and Federal agencies
- Crime Lab Enhancements: NIBIN, Rapid DNA, RECOVER(Prints)
- Detective Involvement in cases earlier
- Crime Suppression Operations: Warrant roundups, traffic enforcement and drug operations.
- ISU:(Violent and Prolific Offenders) Warrant arrests- 131, New Charges- 166, Assists-107, Search Warrants- 19, Firearms- 10
- Community Policing: Engage the community and community organizations.
 - Partner with downtown business to address trespassing and safety
 - Worked with the Gaslight to address after hours problems
 - Retail Blitz operations to deal with shoplifting and other crimes

Hotspot Policing

The Crime Analysis and Criminal Intelligence Unit (CACIU) divided the city into 1000' blocks and conducts bi-weekly analysis based on the individual grids to identify hotspots in activity

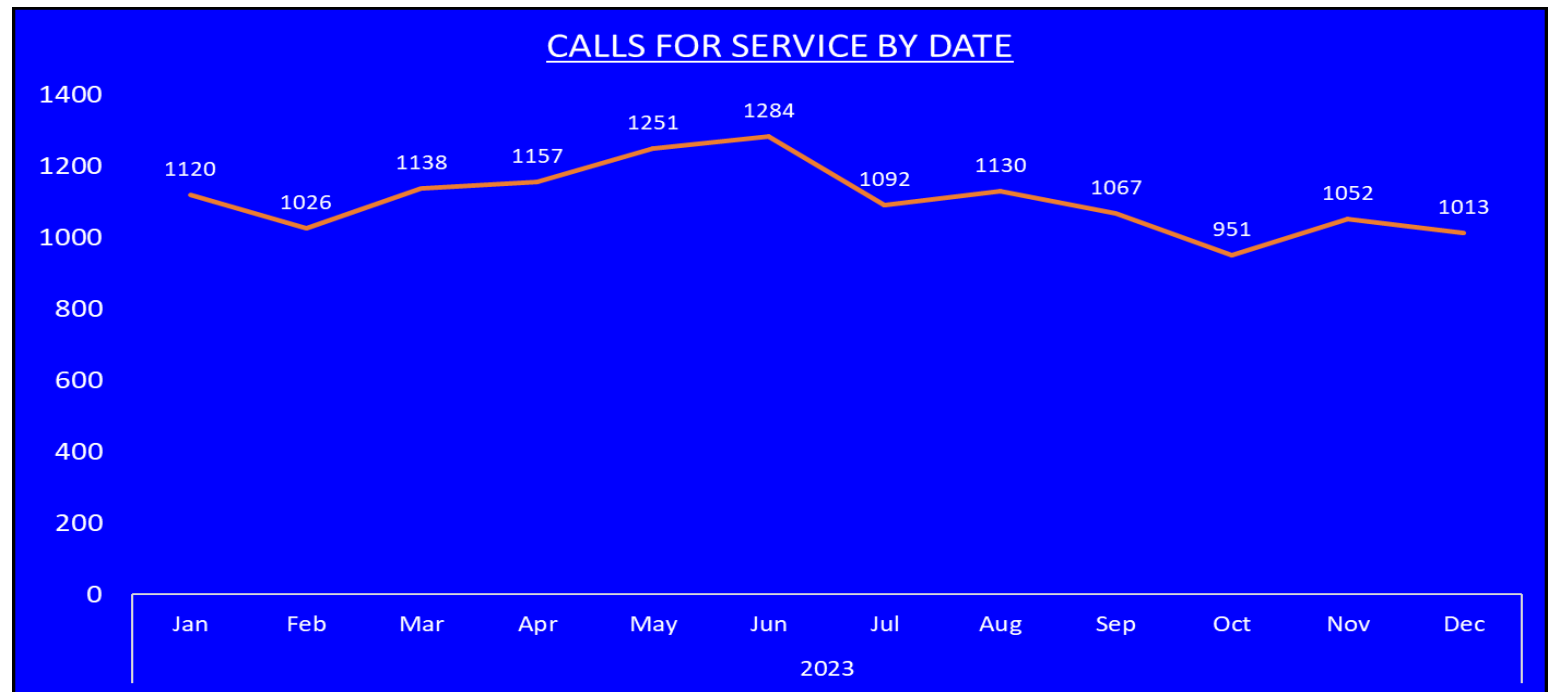
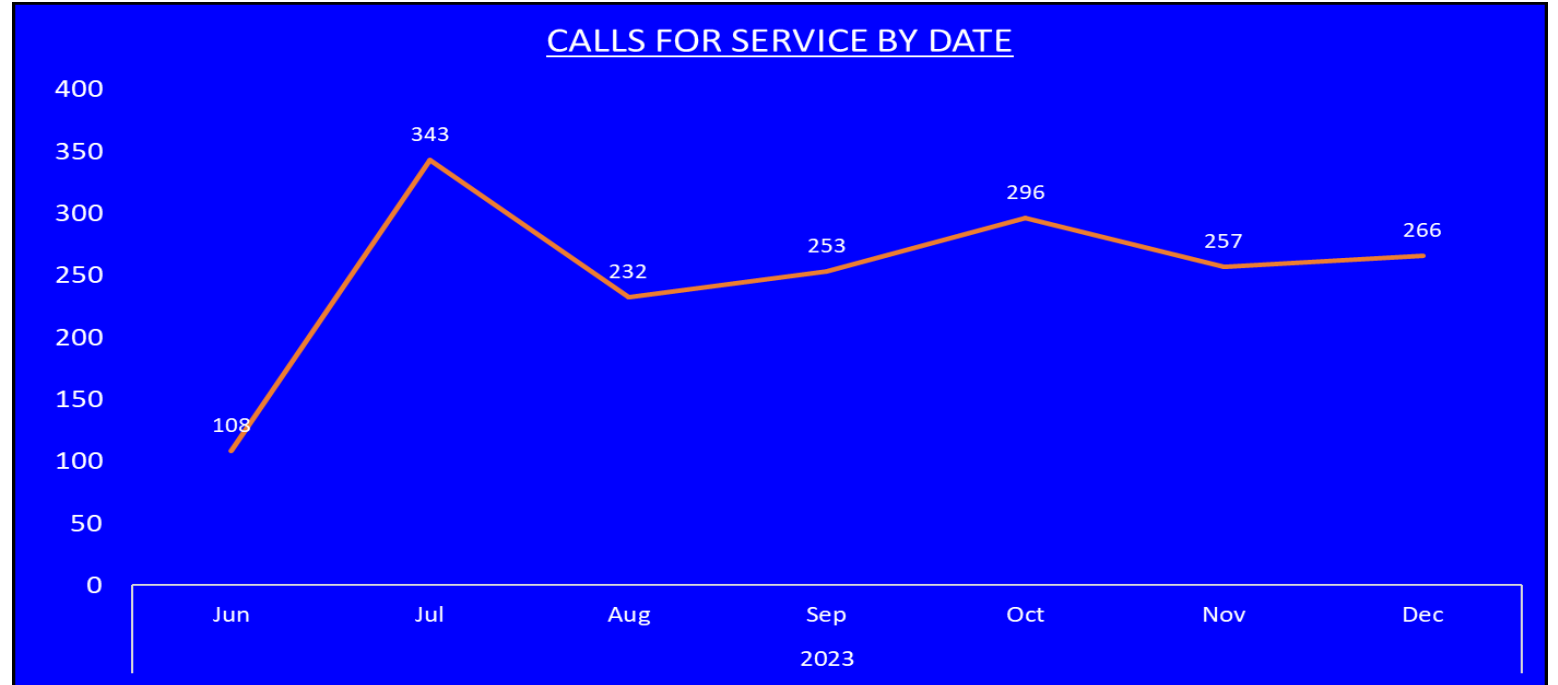
Based on identified hotspots of crime activity, the CACIU makes recommendations for additional patrol presence or activity.

MIT Calls For Service 2023

Top chart shows number of MIT Calls for service since June 2023

Bottom chart shows all APD mental health related CFS handled by patrol.

Notice how patrol CFS dropped starting in July when MIT started full time service



The Anchorage Police Department's **Mobile Intervention Team** is comprised of six Mental Health Clinicians paired with six Crisis Intervention Trained Officers. At least one team is on duty seven days a week between 7AM and 1AM. MIT specializes in responding to persons experiencing a mental health crisis who have a propensity for violence either now or in the past, where there is a criminal nexus. This extraordinary response abandons typical police procedure by exploring options that provide resources, individualized response plans, and a human connection that results in positive momentum toward a healthier life.

Highlight

APD averages 1,500 mental health related calls for service a month. Patrol responds to approximately 1,000 of those calls. MIT handles over 250 calls for service and an additional 140 follow-ups per month.

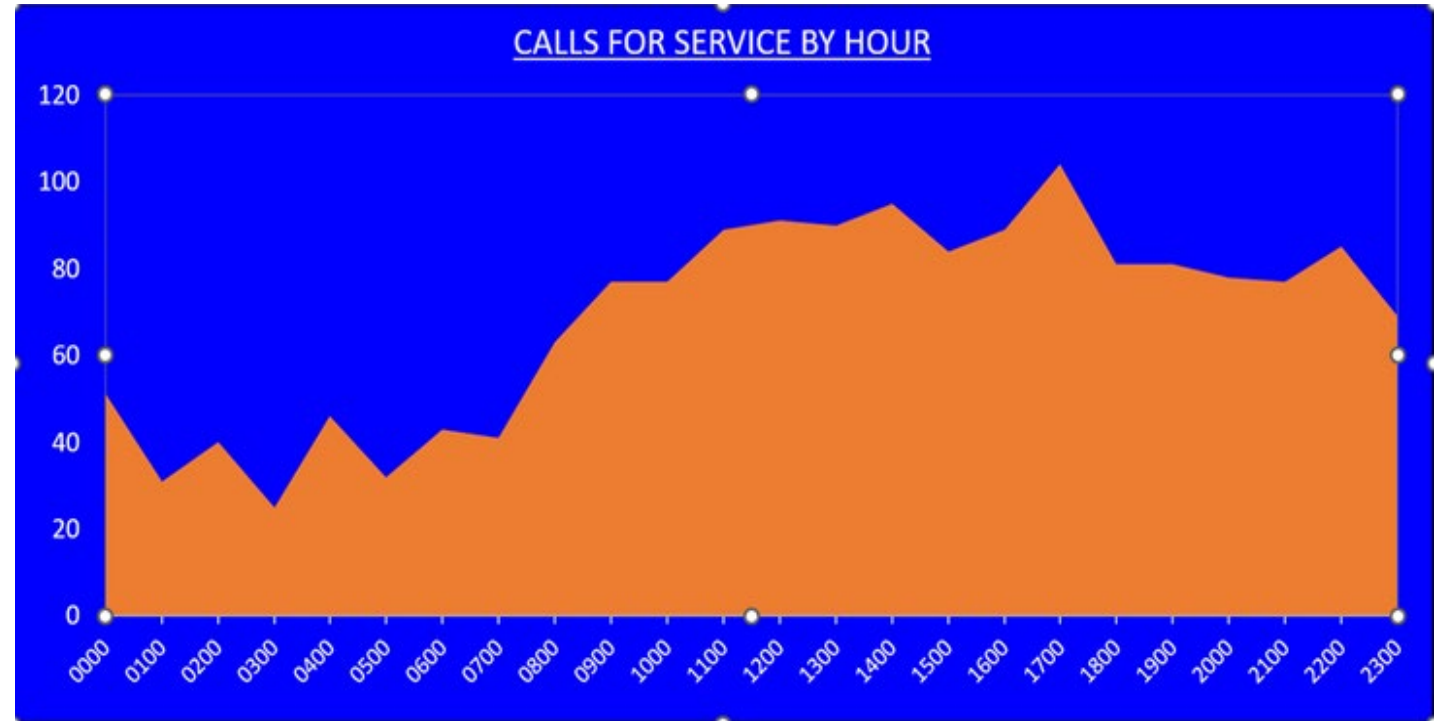
