

- O 2018's stolen vehicle numbers were **ABOVE** the expected average range for all time periods
- O 2023's year to date stolen vehicle numbers is the only category to BELOW the expected average range
- O There was a 77.3% **DECREASE** in reported stolen cars to APD from 2018 to 2023

Stolen Vehicle Trends Within Last 5 Years







- The year to date, 28-day, and week-to-date numbers show an INCREASE in stolen vehicles since 2021
 - All three time periods have approximately a 30% INCREASE compared to the same dates in 2022
- The 365-day to date numbers show a 30.8% DECREASE in stolen vehicles since 2022

Monthly Trends

- There was a 44% INCREASE in stolen vehicles between March 2022 and March 2023 (144 stolen vehicles in March 2023 compared to 100 stolen vehicles in March 2022).
- There was a 33.3% DECREASE in stolen vehicles between March 2023 and April 2023 (144 stolen vehicles in March 2023 compared to 96 stolen vehicles in April 2023)
- DISCLAIMER: May 2023 appears to have low numbers in the graph because it only includes 05/01/2023.




Stolen Vehicle Theft Trends






- A review of the top 10 stolen vehicle makes between January April of 2018-2023 and January April of just this year shows an INCREASE in Hyundai and Kia thefts.
- However, when only counting the top 10 stolen vehicle of April 2018-2023 compared to only April of this year, the theft rates for all models appear to be similar.

Kia/Hyundai Thefts





- There was a 84.8% DECREASE in stolen
 Kias and Hyundais between March 2023
 and April 2023 (33 stolen Kias/Hyundais
 in March 2023 compared to 5 stolen
 vehicles in April 2023)
- The sharp DECREASE was due to the discovery of a theft series and the subsequent arrest of the offender.
 - Kia and Hyundai theft numbers appear to have stabilized since the arrest, but may continue to cause problems if other series occur.
