ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2023-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY AMENDING CHAPTER 10.80 OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE FOR RETAIL MARIJUANA STORES TO ALLOW ACCEPTANCE OF INTERNET AND TELEPHONE ORDERS FOR SALES TO BE PICKED UP AT THE LICENSED PREMISES ONLY WITH IDENTIFICATION CHECK, TO REQUIRE VIDEO SURVEILLANCE OF A DRIVE-THROUGH OR WALK-UP EXTERIOR WINDOW, AND TO REMOVE THE PROHIBITION ON FREE SAMPLES, CONSISTENT WITH UPDATED STATE OF ALASKA REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS, effective August 13, 2023, the State of Alaska, Marijuana Control Board marijuana regulations 3 AAC 306.310 were amended by repealing (a)(5) and 3 AAC 306.995 which prohibited internet sales; and

WHEREAS, effective October 8, 2023, the State of Alaska marijuana regulations 3 AAC 306.310 were amended by deleting the restriction on holders of marijuana retail store licenses to provide samples; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage Municipal Code (AMC) currently prohibits internet sales and providing samples; and

WHEREAS, this ordinance updates AMC Ch. 10.80.310 to allow internet sales and samples to be consistent with State regulations; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 10.80.310 is hereby amended to read as follows (the remainder of the chapter is not affected and therefore not set out):

Chapter 10.80 - LICENSING AND REGULATION OF MARIJUANA ESTABLISHMENTS

10.80.310 - Acts prohibited at retail marijuana store.

A. A licensed retail marijuana store may not sell, give, distribute, deliver, or offer to sell, give, distribute, or deliver, marijuana or any marijuana product:

1. To a person under the age of 21 years of age;

 2. To a person that is under the influence of an alcoholic beverage, inhalant, or controlled substance;

3. That is not labeled and packaged as required in section

- 10.80.345, 3 AAC 306.470 and 3 AAC 306.475 or 3 AAC 306.565 and 3 AAC 306.570;
- 4. In a quantity exceeding the limit set out in section 10.80.355;
- 5. For sales accepted o[O]ver the internet or by telephone, accept payment for the transaction from, and provide the purchased marijuana or marijuana product to any person other than the consumer present at the licensed premises who placed the order[; A LICENSED RETAIL MARIJUANA STORE MAY ONLY SELL MARIJUANA OR A MARIJUANA PRODUCT TO A CONSUMER WHO IS PHYSICALLY PRESENT ON THE LICENSED PREMISES; or]
- 6. <u>Display marijuana or marijuana products at a walk-up or drive-through exterior window; all orders received through it must be placed by the consumer from a menu; or a menu; or the state of the sta</u>
- <u>7.</u> After the expiration date shown on the label of the marijuana or marijuana product.
- B. A licensed retail marijuana store may not:

4. Offer, [OR] deliver, or sell an alcoholic beverage to a consumer[, AS A MARKETING PROMOTION OR] for any [OTHER] reason[,

- A. FREE MARIJUANA OR MARIJUANA PRODUCT, INCLUDING A SAMPLE; OR
- B. ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES, FREE OR FOR COMPENSATION]; or
- 5. Allow intoxicated or drunken persons to enter the licensed premises.

[C. EXCEPTIONS.

 DURING THE TIME IN WHICH THE STATE OF ALASKA ALLOWS FOR INTERNET OR PHONE SALES OR EXTERIOR WINDOW OR CURBSIDE PICKUP OF MARIJUANA OR MARIJUANA PRODUCTS, THE MUNICIPALITY SHALL NOT ENFORCE ANY MUNICIPAL CODE OR REGULATION WHICH PROHIBITS THESE ACTIVITIES.]

10.80.350 Identification requirement to prevent sale to person under 21.

A. A retail marijuana store shall refuse to sell marijuana or a marijuana product or complete a walk-up or drive-through exterior window order of marijuana or marijuana product to a person who does not produce a

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form of valid photographic identification showing that person is 21 years of age or older.

- В. A valid form of photographic identification includes, but is not limited to:
 - 1. An unexpired, unaltered passport;
 - 2. An unexpired, unaltered driver's license; instruction permit, or identification card of a state or territory of the United States, the District of Columbia, or a province or territory of Canada;
 - An identification card issued by a federal or state agency 3. authorized to issue a driver's license or identification card; or
 - A tribal identification card, issued by a federally recognized <u>4.</u> tribe, that meets the following criteria:
 - the identification card has a photograph, a signature, <u>a.</u> and a date of birth, and
 - the identification card has security features as identified <u>b.</u> by AS 28.15.111(a)(4).
- <u>C.</u> If a sale or the pick-up of an internet or telephone order is at a drivethrough exterior window, the retail marijuana store shall require each person in a vehicle at the window to produce identification showing they are each 21 years of age or older, except for the purchaser's own child, grandchild, or ward who is not older than seven years of age.

10.80.720 Video surveillance.

- Α. A marijuana establishment shall install and maintain a video system that must cover:
 - 1. Each restricted access area and each entrance to a restricted access area within the licensed premises:
 - Each entrance to the exterior of the licensed premises; [AND] 2.
 - Each point-of-sale (POS) area; and 3.
 - <u>4.</u> Sales and all interactions at a walk-up or drive-through exterior window, including of the licensee or employee verifying identification and completing the transaction.
- B. At a marijuana establishment, a required video camera must be placed in a way that produces a clear view adequate to identify any individual inside the licensed premises, or within 20 feet of each entrance to the licensed premises. Both the interior and the exterior of each entrance and walk-up or drive-through service window to the facility must be recorded by a video camera.
