WHEREAS, residents of Anchorage continue to identify public safety, violent crime, and homelessness as their top priorities; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage continues to struggle to address and respond to high rates of child abuse, sexual assault, and domestic violence, which threaten the fabric of our community; and

WHEREAS, homelessness causes adverse impacts to vulnerable Alaskans, including mental and behavioral health issues that currently lack sufficient or effective treatment solutions; and

WHEREAS, alcohol consumption and misuse exacerbates problems associated with public safety, violent crime, and homelessness; and

WHEREAS, Anchorage's current fiscal situation dictates the need to consider new revenue options and develop responsible, transparent spending plans to tackle these challenges in an appropriate, evidence-based approach; and

WHEREAS, a proposed 5% retail sales tax on alcohol is expected to bring in \$11-\$15 million dollars in new revenue to the Municipality above the tax cap to be used on services to alleviate Anchorage's most pressing issues; and

WHEREAS, the alcohol sales tax ballot measure, sent to the voters by the Assembly's adoption of AO 2019-148(___), permanently dedicates this new revenue and restricts its use by amendment to the Home Rule Charter, and the ordinance requires separate fund accounts to be established to track the revenue and expenditures; now, therefore

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Section 1. If approved by the voters at the April 7, 2020 regular election, the intent of the Assembly is the revenue collected from a 5% retail sales tax on alcoholic beverages will be spent for new positions and services as detailed in the attached Exhibit A. The Mayor is requested to include in the initially proposed 2021 operating budget funding for service levels reflecting new programs and services described in Exhibit A, sourced from the retail alcohol sales tax.

If approved by a vote of the people during the April 7, 2020 election, the Assembly will continue to work closely with stakeholders and will hold dialogues with members of the community regarding the use of the funds from the alcohol tax.
