CLERK'S OFFICE Submitted by: Chairman of the Assembly at the 5 APPROVED Request of the Mayor 6 Date 11-21-00 7 Prepared by: Office of Management & Budget 8 For Reading: NOVEMBER 21, 2000 9 10 ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR _2000-337 11 12 A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES & CRITERIA TO BE USED IN 13 **DEVELOPING THE 2001 LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM** 14 15 WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly and the Mayor wish to continue to develop 16 a strong working relationship with both the Legislature and the Governor to 17 18 emphasize issues based in Anchorage of local, regional, and statewide significance; and 19 20 WHEREAS, the State's revenue from oil production is at an unanticipated high 21 ievel; and 22 23 WHEREAS, Anchorage represents 41.7% of the State's populations and serves 24 as a regional and statewide center for health care, social services, and cultural 25 and recreational services; and 26 27 WHEREAS, Anchorage needs to receive adequate funding for its public services 28 and critical programs, and 29 30 WHEREAS, a stable revenue base is critical to the financial well being of Alaska 31 32 communities, and 33 WHEREAS, State Revenue Sharing and Safe Communities programs have been 34 cut by 82% overall since 1986, and 35 36 WHEREAS, steady economic development can be attained through the use of 37 innovative financing tools, and 38 39 WHEREAS, an effective public safety program is vital to the health and well 40 being of Anchorage residents and visitors, and 41 42 43 WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Anchorage Municipal Assembly are beginning 44

the process of developing a 2001 Legislative Program.

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NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves that the following guidelines and criteria be used in developing the 2001 Legislative Program:

The Municipality supports legislation that provides a stable revenue source for local governments to help minimize local taxes.

Conservation 50/50 Matching Grant Program.

The Municipality supports the continuation of state grant programs that help municipalities leverage limited resources for worthwhile projects, including the 70/30 Matching Grant Program and the Alaska Department of Environmental

The Municipality intends to request State capital grants that reflect one or more of the following criteria:

- · Projects which are part of a program providing benefits to substantially all of Anchorage.
- Projects which emphasize public safety and health.
- Projects that will provide our city's youth with positive recreational opportunities/alternatives which, in turn may help to reduce juvenile crime.
- Projects expected to produce new long-term positive economic results and strengthen Anchorage's economic base.
- Projects which either reduce or do not increase operations and maintenance costs.
- Projects which address State/Federal mandates, such as ADA.

The Municipality supports legislation to provide local government with adequate State funding of mandated programs/services.

The Municipality opposes transfers of responsibilities or mandates without appropriate funding.

The Municipality intends to oppose any new or increased State taxes that unfairly impact Anchorage.

The Municipality intends to oppose any new legislation that unnecessarily impairs the ability of local government to operate effectively and efficiently.

The Municipality will request fair and equitable treatment with regard to any State FY 2002 funding decisions.

5	The Municipality intends to support legislative changes to clarify and refine
6	existing Alaska Statutes in order to enhance the ability of local government to
7	promote sound economic development.
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9	The Municipality intends to continue to support legislation that will allow the
10	Municipality and State to more effectively deal with police, fire and emergency medical services in Anchorage.
