


CHUGIAK-EAGLE RIVER DOG PARK SITE SELECTION STUDY: 2017 SURVEY RESULTS

Survey conducted by R&M Consultants; results compiled by Municipality of Anchorage Parks and Recreation

329 total responses

The local parks board is considering developing a dog park at Fire House Lane and Eagle River road. The area that is being considered is roughly 270' x 112', or about 5/8 of an acre.




The following 2 questions were asked to those who said they did not want a dog park.


Not ready for a Dog Park here?

(37 responses)




Which of the following best describes where you live? (37 responses)



The remaining questions were asked to respondents who expressed interest in a dog park.


So, you are interested in a dog park...

How interested are you in having a dog park in Eagle River? (292 responses)




This location would be primarily a walking destination dog park. Would you use this park if parking was not available on site?

(290 responses)




If there were a dog park 5 miles from here where you could park your car and walk 500 ft to the dog enclosure, would you be more likely to use that park?




How often would you use this park, if developed? (289 responses)




When would you use the park? (290 responses)

Open-ended comments from all respondents

- Would the park be fenced?
- Would the area on Firehouse Lane have to be deforested in order to put in the park? Where are the alternate locations being considered?
- Would it be fenced?
- Would it be accessible during the winter, meaning is it going to be plowed?!
- Will there be running water for the pets, and would dog have proof of vaccines.
- Will the trees be left on the proposed location? Hoping so.

- Will it be fenced? We don't need more dogs running loose in Eagle River, especially that close to the highway. Right now, we take our dog to Wasilla every week to run and play with others in a fenced and supervised area. It would be great to be able to stay in our community.

- In the question... "If there were a dog park 5 miles from here where you could park your car and walk 500 ft to the dog enclosure, would you be more likely to use that park?" ... Where is "Here" being measured from?
- I would really love a year round dog park! It would be very cool if there was a few lights available for winter time when its dark outside.
- I would like it located in a different area. I think it's too close to a busy road and housing area.
- I would even be willing to pay a small fee per month (\$10 or less a month) to help with maintainance in order to have guaranteed time at the park, kind of like how the private one in Chugiak is set up.
- I would be concerned about being so close to that busy road. How can we
 reassure people that it's safe or maybe it needs to be very very clear that owners
 should have full control over dog before bringing them. If they don't have recall
 it's not a wise choice.
- I will of course be THAT PERSON speaking to everyone about dog poop not being picked up and put in containers etc. We must also consider location of dog park with waste containers being easily accessible to patrons and maintenance crews along with their inevitably smelly impact on any near by surrounding facility as maintenance crews additional coverage required to add disposal of canned waste will be approximately every other day or two depending on park

location and other daily routine tasks taking precedence etc.

- I use the dog parks in Anchorage whenever I can but would definitely use a dog park in the ER/Chugiak area more often.
- I think this is a great idea! Having a fenced area for the dogs to run year-round would be great and I'm sure a lot of residents would use it once the word gets out.

- I think it would be a great idea to have separate closed off areas for small dogs and big dogs. I know some people with smaller dogs would rather not be around larger dogs.
- I live the closest to the proposed spot on Seabolt PI. The 2 BIG issues I have is there going to be someone in charge of picking up the poop? The tennis courts are used as a "dog park" now and come spring it stinks the entire area up! 2nd, when the upgrade was done to the courts we gained a lot of road noise when they cut the trees down for the parking lot. How many trees would be cut down in the proposed area?
- I like the area for the dog park in the photo, but I would be concerned about people parking illegally on the road nearby if there is no parking included in the plan.
- I just want to verify that the park would be full fenced. If it's not fenced dogs with poor recall can not use it. Dogs that already have good recall have other options let's make this a place that those still working on recall can use!
- I have conversations about this potential all the time with people in Eagle River.
- I have both small and large dogs. While I love communal dog parks, larger ones sometimes view smaller as prey. It would be ideal if some sort of division (i.e. fence and gate) were available to close off different parts if needed, if this space would be fenced due to proximity & safety.
- I have a few comments regarding the proposed dog park:
- - The proposed area doesn't seem big enough to be true dog park 5/8 of an acre

is less that a standard size soccer field.

- The location is a concern as it is right on a busy main road; there is potential of owners losing control of their dogs while arriving or departing due to excitement, which may pose an injury risk to dogs in traffic.
- you state this is intended to be a walking destination. The proposed location is not very walker friendly. Again, it's right on a main road and the path / crossings around that area are not very pedestrian-friendly. Also the side roads, such as Firehouse lane have no sidewalks.
- - i don't believe that installing a dog park next to the elementary play areas is a good idea.

- I think the space is too small to support all of Eagle River and surrounding community's needs.

- It doesn't seem large enough for a decent sized dog park for running and to accommodate parking.

- It's too small! There are plenty of run down parks that are larger
- Leave some trees, please!!!
- Not large enough, not enough parking
- Not on a main road, no one wants to see a dog park from the road. Somewhere out of the way and hidden. Bigger location needed as well.
- Proposed site is small, has minimal parking available, Fire House Lane is a very busy street at times and on street parking is dangerous. Need to find another location.
- Teachers at Eagle River Elementary currently utilize those woods for outdoor school (°°°°°°).
 Also the tennis courts have just been updated & are being used regularly by the community. If it smells from waste & muddy pee filled landscape no one will be interested in inhailing that when playing tennis. Please choose another location.
- This area has nice trees and already has a path though that I frequently walk my dog on. Making this a dog park would require these trees to be torn down I'm assuming leaving an area that in my opinion is too small for a fenced in dog park. Too small of a location will lead to disease and crowding. Choose an area where you don't have to tear trees down and ruin a beautiful existing path and that has more room for dogs to run around without getting too far up in people's business.
- This area is much too small for this idea. The space is adjacent to an elementary school and get used by the kids often. There is definitely not adequate parking available for it either. Dog parks in Anchorage are always packed with cars overflowing from the parking available. This is a small residential area that does not need any more traffic or noise.
- This location is directly beside an elementary school. Dog noise and smell should not be directly beside an elementary school.
- This location is prime real estate that should be used for something more valuable. There are
 plenty of less prime more rural large lot areas that would work for this purpose.
- Too small of area with having large and small dogs: Corner congested; Parking area small with the tennis players; WANT THE TREES and many tennis players do too. Suggest park off Farm Avenue Shorder? or Businees Blvd. Park

- We have much more important things to focus on budget, crime, roads. A dog park is the last thing we need to waste our time and money on right now!
- There is no need to spend any money that the city and state don't have to make a park for peoples dogs to play in. This area is very spread out. If someone wants to have their dog run loose then take it for a hike or throw a ball. Don't spend money on stupid shit like this! I am a dog owner (English mastiff 190 pounds). If you cant afford to drive a few minuets to find a good area for your dog to run, then don't by a dog.
- There are already plenty of places you can take your dog and it would fiscally irresponsible for MOA to spend money on a dog park when there are already plenty of options out there.
- Simply not necessary -
- Residents complain about everything in Eagle River, Soon as a dog park is opened they just complain that it's not being up kept, or non eagle River people are there with their pets, or to many teenagers hang out, etc.
- People are too irresponsible. My dog was attacked and nearly killed by an off leash pit bull, and there are always lazy butt people who leave dog poop everywhere. They would not clean up after themselves and it would just be another place for vagrants to frequent. No thank you.
- Our vet has said that dog parks are not safe for dogs because the owners don't
 do enough to police their dogs behavior, and that our dogs could very easily pick
 up diseases from other dogs.
- Nobody will clean up and it will end up a hang out.
- No needed
- No need for a dog park when most people take their loose dogs to the mountains. Or to Lions park (ignoring the no dog signs) placing it there will mean those who use the tennis courts are subjected to noisy barking dogs, those who walk the trail along Eagle River Road will also have added noise and distractions for dogs on leashes.
- Most people here have yards for their dogs to run in. It is an unnecessary expense that taxpayers don't need.
- It is not worth the expense to put in and maintain. People are the problem. My experience with dog parks is there are always people who bring dogs that are not friendly playing with others, they leave it littered, they don't pick up after their

pet.

- I walk my dog at the Town Square and it is full of dog poop all winter long. It just seems like another place for people to forget about cleaning up after their dogs.
- I live in this neighborhood and would not welcome the additional noise of even more barking dogs on top of the increased traffic congestion of putting a park in that spot. People already park on the side of the road here when the road is not wide enough, and I envision traffic getting choked off trying to turn from the main road.
- I just don't feel we need one.
- I grew up in eagle river and now live in anchorage. I've been to all the dog parks and they are DISASTERS. Kennel cough, parvovirus, dog fights, uncontrolled off leash dogs, rude owners and more. More dog parks to me just equals more problems.
- I find dog parks to be a breeding ground for sickness and disease in dogs. They are dirty and gross.
- ER has a large number of open spaces both parks and chugs have forest for dogs as long as you pick up after them including on ER elementary school grounds which offers a tree free area right next to proposed area. Also anytime you can preserve trees for green belt that is a community need and priority and this area would have to be cleared to make such a small area possible to exercise a dog! It's too small and not needed
- Dog parks have a tendency to end up as a dog poop park, barking dogs and of course aN area of concentrated dog poop to run off into the nearest waterway.
- Dog parks are not a good idea. people who have little to no control of their dogs, or understanding of dog behavior, frequent them and it causes long term issues when a dog is attacked. On leash dog walking is a responsible form of excercise. Dogs don't need un regulated free time playing together, that is not how dog behavior and pack structure works. I never take my dogs to dog parks and never recommend my dog training clients talking their pets there either. It causes life long problems of fear aggression in dogs.
