

What are the Mayor's Arts Grants?

Recognition through grant awards to non-profit producers and community-based arts organizations that offer: visual, performing, literary, media, performance, or traditional/folk arts or crafts, multidisciplinary or new genre works.

The Arts Commission reviews grant applications and makes recommendations to the Mayor, who sets final award determinations.

\$110,000 was awarded to 21 organizations in 2020.

*The Municipality does not fund proposals that do not meet threshold requirements or public school-based programs.
