


Homelessness: Progress and Partnerships



Progress

- 18% fewer homeless adults
- 40 % fewer emergency calls to Bean's Café and Brother Francis Shelter
- 179 % increase in camp abatements

Forward thinking infrastructure


- Climate Action Plan
