General Situation

Anchorage - July 26, 2019 – 0900 –The Anchorage Coalition to End Homelessness shared the following information at 11:45am

- Shelters which open may see up to 250 people, more if the weather is rainy or cold during the BFS shutdown. There is a potential to see up to 400 people
- Daytime Utilization may be more due to day services being cut at Clare house, however, the Downtown Hope Center can take the Clare House residents during the day.
- Beans Café is having their bathrooms redone at this time and have three (3) portable toilets onsite, behind their fence.
- Beans Café serves breakfast and lunch. Beans is providing 600 meals for lunch, and is growing 30% per meal including users who have not accessed services before. Beans will provide dinner for the 10 respite beds at BFS that will continue to be open during the August 1-4 closure.
- Youth shelters, AWAIC and other facilities serving youth have not had to cutting bed space or day or night services.
- BFS usually provides dinner for residents, provided by Providence Alaska Medical Center, and is served at the site.
- There are regulations that govern staff to resident ratios, and ACEH will send those over, as well as do research on if these regulations relax during emergency sheltering operations. For BFS, their ratio is 1provider to 50 clients, at the womens shelter there is 1 provider to 25 client ratio and Beans has a 1 provider to 25 client during cold weather operations.
- Downtown Hope Center had a water main break at their facility on 7/25/19. They are hoping it will be resolved by the time night operations commence.
- The MOA Assembly Special Sub-Committee on Homelessness will convene on July 26, 2019 at 10:00am to discuss the issue. A Special MOA Assembly meeting will be held on July 26, 2019 at 11:30am to determine status of the Civil Emergency as well as a decision on next steps.
