Anchorage July 29, 2019 1200

- Currently CSS is working closely with the Municipality to get an agreement in place by Monday and therefore will not reduce services at Brother Francis Shelter.
- Beans Café needs three (3) additional portable toilets
- United Way's provider profile within the Alaska 2-1-1 database has been updated to include volunteer opportunities. Caller's utilizing the 2-1-1 system wanting to volunteer and assist with the community response will be tracked and linked to current volunteer needs.
