The project has been added to Capital Project Needs List for evaluation and prioritization. 15th Ave to Orca St Area Pedestrian Overpass Concern has been expressed about safety for pedestrians crossing 15th Avenue at Orca Street Goal: Scope: Construct pedestrian overpass. Status: No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. The project has been added to Capital Project Needs List for evaluation and prioritization. 16th Ave Surface Rehab - C St to Gambell St Pavement on this collector street is deteriorating. Goal: Scope: This project will provide pavement rehabilitation on a collector route serving the Sullivan Arena Sports Complex. Improvements are expected to include pavement overlay or replacement and ADA upgrades. Design funding is proposed for 2012 with constructio Status: Design funding is proposed for 2012. Funding is proposed with local bonds. 16th Ave/Terr Area Circulation Improvements - Medfra St to Orca St Goal: The upgrade to 15th Avenue has affected traffic circulation and access in this area. Project will widen an alley to residential street standards to safely accommodate new traffic volumes. Scope: Proposed scope is to identify options and cost estimates, and pursue design and construction of recommended improvements. ROW acquisition in progress with consultant continuing with design work. Both houses on north Status: side of 16th have been acquired. Construction scheduled for 2008.

The traffic signal detection loops are deteriorated and the signal system is at the end of its design life. Project is being re-scoped and scheduled in conjunction with development of planned Scope: improvements to E Street and the Park Strip. Project will include new traffic signals, street illumination, ADA improvements, pedestrian and bike paths and landscape impro Project re-scoped again to provide for reconstruction to three lane section in 2008 between L Status: Street and LaTouche Street with landscape and hardscape improvements to strengthen pedestrian connection between Fairview and Downtown. A/C Couplet Pavement Replacement - Port to Tudor Rd Pavement is deteriorating. Goal: Scope: Overlay and/or replace pavement. No work is underway. This is a state owned facility and prioritization and funding would be Status: through the State of Alaska. A/C Couplet Restripe to 4-lane - 9th Ave to Tudor Rd When constructed, pavement width was constructed to allow for a future restripe to 4-lanes if Goal: and when traffic volumes demonstrated the need. No studies have been completed demonstrating the need at this time. Scope: Eventual restripe from a 3-lane to a 4-lane configuration. No work is underway. This is a state owned facility. Status: C St at 20th Ave Drainage The existing storm outfall is lower than the creek which causes sedimentation and ice build up in the system. The facility serves a local neighborhood. This project is a priority for street maintenance. This project will construct a drainage lift station and a new storm drain outfall into Chester Scope: Creek at 20th Avenue. Status: No work is underway, but a 2007 state grant has been requested. **Downtown Area Storm Outfall Reconstruction** Several downtown area storm drain outfalls into Ship Creek have deteriorated to the point that Goal: major repair or replacement is required. Scope: This project will reconstruct existing storm drain outfalls into Ship Creek. Some of the outfalls may be combined.

Engineer is currently re-evaluating the design documents to ensure constructability.

Construction funding is proposed for 2009.

Goal: Scope: Project will replace undersized storm drain pipe in three locations identified on the system. Another segment, significantly blocked by tree roots, will be replaced. Status: Construction is in winter shutdown. Work will begin June 15, 2007 Fairbanks St Surface Rehab - 5th Ave to 9th Ave Goal: Pavement on this street is deteriorating. Scope: Replace or overlay pavement. Status: No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. Project has been added to Capital Project Needs List for evaluation and prioritization. Fairview Area Alley Paving Goal: The alleys have never been constructed to standards and have inadequate drainage. Scope: Upgrade alleys with a new road base, storm drainage, and pavement. No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. Funding will be Status: through the 30/70 Upgrade Road Improvement District program in which the project is initiated by property owners who agree to pay 70% of the costs through special assessments. Fairview Area Pedestrian and Street Amenities To increase pedestrian safety in this high traffic area. Goal: Pedestrian and Streetscape improvements will be identified in the public involvement process Scope: in coordination with the Fairview Community Council, Traffic, and Transit. Phase I of this project is adding pedestrian facilities to the State's 13th Avenue and Gambell Status: Street Safety Improvements scheduled for 2007 construction, Additional improvements with future funding are being identified through coordination with the Fairview Community Council, Traffic, and Transit. Gambell St/Ingra St Corridor Enhancements Goal: Interest in pedestrian and visual enhancements to this corridor has been expressed. Scope: Not set. Status: No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a state-

owned facility and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska.

Scope: Preliminary study funding has been provided. Additional study funding is proposed for 2008 Status: and 2009 through the AMATS TIP and the DOT STIP. Glenn Hwy/5th Ave Expansion - Gambell St to McCarrey St Goal: This road section is one of the most congested roads in Anchorage in both morning and afternoon peak hours. Scope: Improvements are expected to include the addition of a through lane in each direction. Status: Design is underway and construction is anticipated in 2008 and 2009. This is a state owned facility. Highway to Highway Connection - Bragaw St to 20th Ave Goal: Congestion is growing throughout Anchorage. One option being evaluated in the Highway to Highway Connection. Scope: Connect the Seward Highway to the Glenn Highway through the Fairview area, while improving connectivity within that neighborhood. Environmental efforts are underway by the state. This is a state owned facility evaluation and Status: funding would be through the State of Alaska. The project is also being managed by the state. Ingra St Channelization - 3rd Ave to 4th Ave (HSIP) Goal: Safety issues have been identifies in this corridor. Channelization will be installed to address safety issues. Scope: Design is substantially complete and 2007 construction is anticipated. Funding is through the Status: Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP). Ingra St/Gambell St Extension - 3rd Ave to Whitney Rd The connection will be a critical transportation connection to minimize traffic impacts on downtown, if the Knik Arm Crossing moves forward. Scope: Construct major transportation corridor.

Goal: Scope: Complete rut repair improvements which may include pavement replacement or overlay. Status: No work is underway. This is a state owned facility and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska. Karluk St Traffic Calming - 8th Ave to 13th Ave Goal: Vehicle and pedestrian safety concerns have been raised. Scope: Construct traffic calming measures, to be determined through community input. Status: No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. However, work may be planned as part of the Fairview Area Pedestrian and Street Amenities Project or the Traffic Departments annual Traffic Calming program. Seward Hwy Expansion - 20th Ave to 36th Ave Traffic on this freeway already exceeds the capacity of the existing facility. Goal: Scope: While the scope has not been established, this freeway segment is a significant link in the Highway to Highway connection to the Glenn Highway. Specific improvements will be identified in further design efforts not currently funded. A major investment study has been completed by the State of Alaska. This is a state-owned facility and evaluation and future funding would be by the State of Alaska. The route is identified as a Freeway in the Official Streets and Highways Plan. Son of Downtown Area Curb Bulb Project (HSIP) Goal: Safety concerns have been identified at several downtown intersections. Scope: This project will construct curb bulb improvements to slow traffic at intersections. Status: Design by the State of Alaska is substantially complete and construction is anticipated in 2007. Funding is through the Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP).
