Status: Design efforts by the State of Alaska for an upgrade to O'Malley road have been funded. This is a state-owned facility and evaluation and funding would be by the State of Alaska. This route is designated as a minor arterial in the Official Streets and Highways Plan (OS&HP).

While the scope is not set, minor arterial improvements typically include a new road base,

pavement, curbs, storm drains, street lighting, pedestrian facilities, and landscaping.
