Total ROW and utility phases costs are expected to be \$3 million. Arctic Blvd Phase II - Right-Turn Lane at Tudor Rd The current configuration of the north leg of the Arctic Blvd/Tudor Rd intersection is inadequate Problem: to handle existing traffic. Adds a right-turn lane for traffic going west on Tudor Road. Scope: Design is in progress, easement acquisition, and utility relocation phases have begun. Final Status: construction phase funding is proposed with bonds for 2010 in the approved CIP. Arctic Blvd Phase III Reconstruction - 36th Ave to Tudor Rd Pavement is deteriorated and the current 4-lane configuration is not efficient and has safety Problem: issues. Improvements are expected to include pavement, curbs, a center turn lane, medians, Scope: pedestrian facilities on both sides, street lighting, storm drains, and landscaping. The actual scope will be developed during the design phase which includes public invov The Design Study indicates the need for a 5-lane road section along the 36th-to-Tudor Status: segment of Arctic Blvd. Design phase efforts have been partially funded. CIP approved funding: Design-2009, ROW-2010, Utilities-2011, Construction-2012, Remaining design schedule subject to funding availability. Arctic Blvd Phase IV Pavement Rehab - Tudor Rd to Raspberry Rd Pavement on this arterial street is deteriorating beyond the point that maintenance is cost Problem: effective. In addition, channelization improvements and ADA upgrades are required. This project will overlay or replace the existing pavement, as well as making the channelization Scope: improvements and ADA upgrades. Final Design is in progress. Construction is planned for 2009 and 2010 if funding is provided. Status: Construction funding is in the approved CIP for 2009 and 2010.

This Problem: project is a priority in the Anchorage Pedestrian Plan. This project will construct pedestrian safety improvements at this intersection of arterial streets Scope: to be determined in the study phase. The project has not started. A 2008 state grant has been requested to fully fund this project. Status: Chester Creek Aquatic Habitat Restoration - Westchester Lagoon Improvements Reconstruct the existing outfall from Westchester Lagoon into Cook Inlet which does not Problem: adequately allow for fish passage. Phase I of this project relocated the existing utilities at the Westchester Lagoon outfall into Scope: Cook Inlet. Phase II will reconstruct the outfall into Cook Inlet and is complete. This project is funded. Design is substantially complete and bidding is expected in the spring of Status: 2008. Fish Creek Improvements - Cook Inlet to Lake Otis Pkwy Development has affected the natural flow of the creek and creek capacity is inadequate for Problem: current flow. Construct water quality and drainage capacity improvements on Fish Creek. Scope: This is an annual funding program in the approved CIP. \$500,000 a year in design and Status: construction funding is proposed beginning in 2010. Several phases have already been funded and constructed. International Airport Rd Expansion - Jewel Lake Rd to Arctic Blvd)ELETÉ Anticipated traffic increases may require additional capacity. Problem: Possibly expand from 2-lane to 3-lane configuration in each direction. Scope: No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a state Status: route and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska. Kloep Station Snow Disposal Site Upgrades Snow disposal site is on state land and doesn't meet current standards. Problem: Resolve ownership/lease issues and upgrade to current standards. Scope: Design is substantially complete. Ownership/lease/land transfer issues are being resolved. Status: Construction funding is proposed for 2010 in the approved CIP.

This project will construct a new access road for use by truck traffic. Truck traffic will be Scope: prohibited from the portion of Van Buren Street used to access parks and recreation facilities. Improvements are expected to include pavement, curbs, and stree Design efforts have been funded. Final easement acquisition is being negotiated. Evolving Status: economic and ownership issues have made selection of a final alternative a challenge. A requested 2008 state grant would provide a 50/50 funding partnership. Construction funding is proposed for 2008 in the approved CIP. STATE OF ALASKA Fireweed Ln Reconstruction - Spenard Rd to Seward Hwy Safety and capacity concerns with the existing 4-lane road section, especially with regard to pedestrians and non-motorized travel. Project involves complete reconstruction of Fireweed Lane between Spenard Road and the Scope: Seward Highway and will include pedestrian, transit, bicycle and landscape improvements. This project will convert an existing 4-lane facility into a 3-lane facility with a continuous left turn lane, protected left turn lanes at major intersections.
