Glenn Hwy	Expansion - North Eagle River Access Rd to South Birchwood Lp		
Problem:	The Long Range Transportation Plan anticipates the need to add lanes to address increased traffic volumes and congestion.		
Scope:	Tentative scope would include expanding both north and south directions from 2-lane to 3-lane configurations.		
Status:	No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a state owned facility and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska.		
Glenn Hwy	Interchange - between North and South Birchwood Loop Rds		
Problem:	No access exists to the Glenn Highway between North Birchwood Loop Road and South Birchwood Loop Road. Construction would have some access and area circulation benefit.		
Scope:	Scope would likely include construction of some type of separated intersection.		
Status:	No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a state owned facility and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska. The project was nominated for inclusion in the Long Range Transportation Plan.		
Glenn Hwy	Standard Highway Lighting - Hiland Rd to South Birchwood Loop		
Problem:	Interest in improved lighting on the Glenn Highway has been expressed.		
Scope:	Install improved lighting using standard highway lights. Hightower lighting is not desired due to the light "pollution" it produces.		
Status:	A state grant was provided for the phase I of these improvements. This is a state owned facility and the project is being managed by the State of Alaska. Future funding is uncertain. No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program.		
Glenn Hwy	Standard Highway Lighting - South Birchwood Loop to Knik Bridge		
Problem:	Interest has been expressed in improved lighting to improve safety.		
Scope:	Install standard lighting improvements on the Glenn Highway.		
Status:	No work is currently scheduled in the 6-year Capital Improvement Program. This owned facility and evaluation and funding would be through the State of Alaska.	s is a state	
North Birch	nwood Loop Rd Gravel Multi-purpose Trail		
Problem:	There are no pedestrian facilities along most of this arterial route. Local wheelchair users and others must use the road itself and the road shoulders are narrow.

While the scope will be developed in the design study phase, improvements are expected to Scope: include a new road base, paved roads and shoulders, drainage, and pedestrian facilities. No work is underway or scheduled in the six-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a Status: state-owned facility and evaluation and funding would be by the State of Alaska. The route is identified as an arterial in the Official Streets and Highways Plan. North Eagle River Access Rd/Old Glenn Hwy Area Intersection Safety Problem: Concerns about traffic and pedestrian safety in this developing area have been raised. Scope: Study and analyze the traffic patterns, pedestrian access, and safety issues in the area of this North Eagle River intersection. The study will include the Snowmobile Lane intersection. Status: This project has not started. A 2008 state grant is proposed to fund this study. South Birchwood Loop Rd Pavement Rehab Problem: The pavement on this collector is beginning to deteriorate. Replace the existing surface with new layers of asphalt. Scope: Status: There is currently no funding programmed in the six-year CIP. This is a state-owned facility and evaluation and funding would be by the State of Alaska. South Birchwood Loop Rd Upgrade - Old Glenn Hwy to North Birchwood Loop Rd Problem: This street is not constructed to suburban collector standards. While the scope is not set, suburban collector improvements typically include a new road Scope: base, paved lanes and shoulders, pedestrian facilities, and street lighting. No work is underway or scheduled in the six-year Capital Improvement Program. This is a Status:
