PRIORITY RANK

(1) Street Master Plan and Rehabilitation

There are many streets, such as Lunar Drive, James St., etc. that are in need of major rehabilitation. The Council believes that a street survey should be done of all streets and a Master Plan developed to address reconstruction as soon as possible.

- (2) <u>32nd Ave Upgrade Muldoon Rd to Brookridge Dr</u>
 This road upgrade has been a high priority for several years.
- (3) <u>36th Ave Upgrade (RTP) Patterson St to Muldoon Rd</u>
 Road upgrade, traffic calming and safety improvements for children walking to Scenic Park Elementary School are long overdue.
- (4) <u>Totem Fields Park/ASD Partnership Phase II</u>

 SFCC has been trying for several years to get these needed additional recreational facilities available for the large number of youth we have in our Council area.

OTHER COMMENTS

Ranking.

SFCC has chosen to make a single ranking of the items considered to be of highest priority. The instructions from OMB asked for ranking within Departments, however that makes no sense to have a single item in a Department show, by default, a #1 ranking when it is very low on our priorities.

Pioneer Drive

This project has been discussed before but not high ranked by the Council. Recent preliminary design efforts brought forth significant opposition to the project as it was proposed as a Collector Street. The greatest priority here may be to enhance parking adjacent to the Park. The Council suggests continuation of funding for design work. Additional discussion with affected property owners and the Council is requested before any funding for construction. The Council expects to discuss this in the Fall, 2009.

Fire Department Station Improvements

SFCC <u>does not support</u> the proposed North access to **Fire Station 14**. It is not a life/safety issue and is considered an inappropriate expenditure of money especially during a time in which capital funding will be limited.

Other

The Council <u>took no position</u> on the **Chester Creek Improvements** or on the **Tudor Road access Management**.
