RE: Clarification for correction in OMB-generated listing for 2011 Capital Projects

This is the <u>current</u> listing as shown below and generated by OMB in response to requests by Birchwood Community Council and also carried and shown by our sister council, Chugiak Community Council;

Chugiak-Eagle River Areawide Aquifer Study and Drainage Plan

Scope: will study the aquifer in the C-ER area and make drainage plan recommendations

Need: Development in this region has produced a need for plan...to handle future drainage needs

Status: Study funding is proposed with a 2010 state grant

Est Cost: \$500,000 Funds on Hand: \$0 Additional Funds

Required: \$500,000

We originally added these to the Birchwood requested CIP list in 2008, as follows;

Chugiak-Eagle River Areawide Drainage Plan (Addition)

Problem: roads, pathways, residential and commercial development expanding due to population expansion, and without a study and plan in place for proper site selection to manage storm water drainage along with surface water quality we will continue to inadvertently create our own drainage problems until we inventory and plan according to natural drainage features. This is also number 13 in the Chugiak-Eagle River Comprehensive Plan Implementation Schedule. We need to undertake a Drainage Study and formulate a sound Plan

as quickly as possible. This would be under the direction of PM&E (MOA).

Chugiak-Eagle River Areawide Subsurface Aquifir Study (Addition)

Problem: A majority of the developed properties in Chugiak-Eagle River rely upon on-site water well and septic systems rather than public utilities. Little is known of the location of all subsurface aquifirs that serve these rural properties and it appears that living on large rural lots with a major employment center within commuting distance has become very popular and will continue to be so. It is very difficult to properly plan to serve this type of lifestyle and mistakes have a long lasting impact on the health and the environment as well as to the pocketbook. This is stated in the Chugiak-Eagle River Comprehensive Plan as something that should be investigated. Normally these types of studies are undertaken by the USGS or the Alaska DGGS

OMB AND PM&E KEEP CONFUSING THESE TWO PROJECTS

AND COMBINING THEM AS ONE PROJECT. I first explained this to Bruce Holmes when the list was submitted again the year following our original addition to the CIP lists where we again ranked them. I believe these are two separate projects as each has a different objective, deal with separate issues and having different consequences, will be undertaken by two different agencies each having a different jurisdiction, and each has a separate funding pot. Discuss and correct.

I was actually contacted by our local area Legislators this year who were ready and willing to provide funding for what they thought was a single project and I told them that until I could get the Municipality of Anchorage to comprehend what we were actually asking for, and why, that it would be unproductive to provide funding because the Municipality doesn't have a clue what we are asking them to complete on behalf of this area.

The Drainage Plan Project: Birchwood supports an expansion and upgrade to the existing Eagle River Drainage Study (Macinnis Consulting, 1987) to also include those areas that have developed since the Study was published. For whatever reason, whether the 1987 Study was consulted and then ignored, or not consulted, we are having to expend a great deal of money annually to overcome some unexpected drainage problems during infrastructure construction by our local Road Service Area Board as well as consequences resulting from subdivision development that created negative drainage consequences endangering other properties (both public and private) affecting both State and local jurisdictions.

The Aquifer Study Project, which we see as a separate project is to be a study to determine the location and capacity and chemistry of sub-surface aquifers for over which half of the population of the Chugiak-Eagle River depends, and will continue to depend upon, for their on-site water wells. In South Fork, Eklutna Valley, and the upper part of Eagle River Valley which are all areas outside of the AWWU certificate of service boundaries, we are seeing more and more private development. In the Birchwood and Chugiak council areas, we have areas that are also developing but extremely difficult to bring public water into because of pressure zones, topography, and such plus the area residents do not wish to switch from on-site systems due to the very high expense of doing so.

The new proposed Title 21 rewrite is attempting to reduce lot sizes in these large lot areas where we have existing development thereby encouraging those holders of vacant properties to further subdivide bringing additional on-site systems (sometimes with clustering which is not thoroughly reviewed by the responsible agency) into developed areas where the existing aquifers marginally may not be able to safely serve both existing and new development. Until we fully know and understand the capacity and location of all aquifers, this is a negative and irresponsible process to encourage. Normally this is undertaken by the DGGS or USGS and builds on their existing knowledge base by core drilling and other accepted methods to examine potential areas that might have new, unmapped aquifers. In the past, some smaller investigations were done by MOA's DHHS.
