Department Goal:

The Goal of the Fire Department for the 1991-1996 CIP is to provide effective and efficient emergency operations, fire suppression, and emergency medical capability through replacement of older fire apparatus, equipment, and medic units and establishment of an improved emergency telecommunications network.

Anchorage Fire:

The \$2,920,000 in requested general obligation bond funds and \$6,606,000 in state grant funds for the 1991-1996 CIP will provide for necessary replacement of aged fire apparatus, emergency generators and equipment, renovation of existing fire facilities, and purchase of property for future replacement of fire station #7 Sand Lake.

Chugiak Fire:

Requested state grant funds of \$837,000 will provide necessary replacement of aged equipment for the Chugiak Volunteer Fire Company.

Emergency Medical Services:

The \$2,025,000 in general obligation bond funds and \$499,000 in state grant funds in the 1991-1996 CIP will provide for replacement of medic units and equipment to sustain emergency medical services capability throughout the Municipality, and upgrade of the emergency radio communication system in Anchorage, Eagle River, Chugiak and Girdwood.
