MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL SERVICES

Department Goal:

The goal of the Cultural and Recreational Services Department for 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program is to provide improved recreational opportunities, enhanced library and information services to all segments of the community, and raise and protect the water quality of local streams, thereby improving those aspects of community life and neighborhood values which depend on clean and aesthetically appealing surface water. Improvement of the library system is sought to expand the materials collection, update equipment and upgrade the automated library system used to access the collection. In Parks and Recreation, continuing efforts will be made to enlist public participation (donations of labor, money, materials); to upgrade present parks and trails, complete current park projects, and develop facilities where deficiencies require additional parks and recreational areas. Land acquisition will be pursued in areas most deficient. Input was obtained from individual citizens, neighborhood associations, community councils, Parks and Recreation Commission, Library Advisory Board, Eagle River Parks and Recreation Advisory Board, Girdwood Board of Supervisors, and staff.

Library:

The 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program for the Library focuses on projects designed to support and enhance the delivery of library and information services to Anchorage residents, while enriching both the educational and economic climate of the community.

Upgrade of the current automated library system to take advantage of technological improvements made over the last seven years would improve user access to the library's collections. This replacement would provide adequate database space for anticipated collection growth, permit the addition of public access terminals as needed, and improve response time to both public and staff users, saving time and increasing efficiency.

The current 1.9 book volumes per capita available in the Anchorage Municipal Library system falls short of the average 2.3 similar-sized populations: The acquisition of approximately 90,000 volumes or alternate information formats, including additional required shelving, would raise the per capita figure to the national 2.3 average.

MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL CENTER

Cemetery:

The 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program for the Cemetery focuses on the Capital development required to restore the former Willow Park Apartments site to cemetery use by 1993 or 1994. Site survey, fencing, road and utilities extension and signage will be required.

Park Acquisition:

This program will continue to fill out existing greenbelts emphasizing water quality improvement and public access, as well as new neighborhood parks. Acquisition will be funded primarily through state grants and management transfers with the Heritage Land Bank supplemented by private donations and formation of park improvement districts.

Greenbelt Acquisition:

Acquire land along Rabbit, Fish, Little Campbell and Chester Creeks, as well as Peters Creek, Little Rabbit Creek, Potter Creek and designated wetlands as budget and community priorities direct, sufficient to protect local creeks, creek banks, and the immediate upland area along these creeks from human and domestic animal contamination and encroachment by structures and other "improvements" which would otherwise threaten the water quality. The designated wetlands which are included in the Greenbelt Acquisition program should be preserved because of their valuable habitat, proximity to existing Municipal park lands, and areas of important habitat and hydrological values. These wetlands areas selected for acquisition have been chosen because of documented high resource value.

Girdwood Park and Trail:

The 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program for Girdwood fills community needs for extension of pathways and improvements to the Town Square and Forest Fair Park Area.

MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE CULTURAL AND RECREATIONAL SERVICES

Eagle River/Chugiak Park and Trail:

The 1991-1996 Capital Improvement Program for Eagle River/Chugiak includes development of land for greenbelts and neighborhood parks and development of Schroeder Airstrip, Loretta French Park, Beach Lake Park, and Peters Creek Park, as well as the general upgrading of the area's parks.

Park and Trail Development:

This program provides major emphasis on park and trail rehabilitation, reducing maintenance cost and completion of existing projects currently under construction throughout the community. Dempsey Anderson Ice Arena expansion is proposed. Major reconstruction is planned for Campbell and Chester Creek Trails, Anchorage Football Stadium, Valley of the Moon Park, Kincaid Park, Storck Park, Russian Jack Springs Park, and others. Maximum use will be made of park improvement districts, volunteers, donations, and other fund raising efforts to increase community involvement and reduce public expenditures.

There is to be considerable effort to repair and rehabilitate the present parks and trails and to focus on neighborhood needs.

Linkages between major trails will be completed to expand the role of the areawide trails system and become a major element of both the transportation and recreation systems.

Neighborhood parks will be improved where needed and additional sports fields for organized athletics will be developed to meet expanding program needs.
