

The Anchorage Civil Defense/Disaster Department follows program guidance provided by Region 8, Defense Civil Preparedness Agency and the Alaska Disaster Office. We are presently following a federal program concerned with the production of comprehensive preparedness plans and preparations for implementation under natural disaster conditions such as earthquakes, volcanic eruptions, tidal wave and major aircraft crashes. The Defense Civil Preparedness Agency is now charged with natural disaster planning. In line with this several changes have been made in restrictions and authority for the acquisition of surplus property and property declared excess to military unit needs. The new excess property program allows the Civil Defense Agency to acquire vehicles, rescue equipment, fire-fighting equipment and other gear that could be used during natural disaster conditions at no cost to the local government. This department is providing surplus property and excess property service to the Greater Anchorage Area Borough Public Safety Department. For this service they paid the City \$4,500 in 1972, and will again budget that amount in 1973 for this service, resulting in a reduction in the total cost of the Department to the City. Through the month of August, 1972, the surplus property program has resulted in the acquisition of \$27,000 worth of useable, serviceable equipment at a cost of \$3,600 to the City. In 1973 we expect to see this activity considerably expanded to provide a wider variety of heavy equipment items for City use.

This budget is considered the minimum to assure the Civil Defense/Disaster Department the capability of providing an effective program.

Training will continue to be carried out in the fields of Medical Self-Help, Adult Education, Radiological Monitoring and Civil Defense Management.

The Department is currently involved in studies relative to the implementation of the 911 Emergency Telephone Number, and the study is expected to be completed during 1973.

This budget meets the federal requirements regarding 50 percent matching funds. Fifty percent federal funds plus the Borough funding will result in a cost to the City for the Civil Defense program of \$23,435.
