

#### 2003 Budget Highlights

- Adds 13 new officers as part of the Federal "Cops in Schools" program. Working with the Anchorage School District, this will base officers in the high schools, from which they will also be able to visit the lower level schools. This investment should result in increased school attendance, less vandalism, safer schools, and improved student performance.
- In addition to the 13 new officers, the remaining sworn officers on the street will remain at the same level or higher than this year. The funding provided will enable the average number of patrol officers (23 in 2002) on the street to be maintained, if not exceeded, in 2003.
- Provides full year funding of \$2 million for the Prisoner Care contract at the new jail.
- Increases the contribution for pre-funding of the Police/Fire Medical Trust Fund to higher level determined necessary by the 2002 actuarial study. This brings the budgeted 2003 cost to \$3.4 million for police retirees.
