#### **RESOLUTION 2019-1**

A RESOLUTION RECOMMENDING AMENDMENTS TO THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE REGARDING THE COMMISSION'S MEETING SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, the Salaries and Emoluments Commission was established by Anchorage Municipal Charter § 5.08 to "establish the compensation, including salaries, benefits, and allowances, if any, of elected officials"; and

WHEREAS, Charter § 5.08(d) provides that the Salaries and Emoluments Commission shall, "At least every two years, but not more frequently than every year, the commission ...review the compensation of elected officials"; and

WHEREAS, although Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 4.10, Commission on Salaries and Emoluments, is reserved, there are no Code provisions for the Commission; and

WHEREAS, the Charter § 5.08(d) meeting schedule language is confusing and it will be beneficial to the public, elected officials, and the Commission to have clarifying Code language for the required meeting frequency; and

WHEREAS, the Salaries and Emoluments Commission would like to meet at least once per year, review their work of the prior year, changes in the economy, and other factors, and make a regular decision about when to meet again; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Salaries and Emoluments Commission would like the code to clarify that it may make change not more than once per year, but may have as many informational meetings as necessary to do its review; and

WHEREAS, the members of the Salaries and Emoluments Commission recommend and request enactment of Code provisions that would more clearly guide their mission and duties; now, therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED** the Anchorage Salaries and Emoluments Commission recommends amending AMC Chapter 4.10, *Commission on Salaries and Emoluments*, to provide for organizational and meeting structure, as shown in the attached draft Anchorage Ordinance.

## ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AO No. 2019-XXX

AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY DESCRIBING THE DUTIES AND MEETINGS OF THE COMMISSION ON SALARIES AND EMOLUMENTS, BY ADDING NEW SECTIONS TO ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL CODE CHAPTER 4.10.

WHEREAS, the Section 5.08 of the Home Rule Charter of the Municipality of Anchorage, established a Commission on Salaries and Emoluments. The Charter specifies that "The commission is composed of five members appointed for terms of four years. The commission shall be composed of at least one business executive, one representative of a nonpartisan voters' organization, one person with experience in public administration, and one representative of a labor organization"; and

WHEREAS, Charter § 5.08(d) provides that the Salaries and Emoluments Commission shall, "At least every two years, but not more frequently than every year, ... review the compensation of elected officials"; and

**WHEREAS**, although Anchorage Municipal Code Chapter 4.10, *Commission on Salaries and Emoluments*, is reserved, there are no Code provisions for the Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the Salaries and Emoluments Commission passed Resolution 2019-1 recommending and requesting enactment of the following Code provisions, reviewed at their October 31, 2019, meeting, that would more clearly guide their mission and duties; now, therefore,

## THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

 <u>Section 1.</u> Anchorage Municipal Code chapter 4.10 is hereby amended to add the following new sections:

# 4.10.010 – Commission on Salaries and Emoluments of Elected Officials.

 A. The commission on salaries and emoluments of elected officials established by the Municipal Charter shall have those powers, duties, restrictions, and terms of office more specifically set forth in Section 5.08 of the Charter.

B. The sunset provisions in section 4.05.150 shall not apply to this commission.
