Amendment and Voting Instructions

AMENDMENT PROCESS

Who may offer amendments:

Any member of the public including task force members can offer an amendment.

When amendments will be collected:

Amendments will be collected via email prior to the meeting, and during the meeting before voting begins.

How to propose an amendment:

- State your amendment in one clear sentence.
- Identify the specific section (1, 2, 3, or 4) and the exact language to be changed.
- Amendments must be substantive, not editorial.
- Replacement amendments must include complete substitute text.*

VOTING RULES

Who may vote:

Participants who attended at least one of the prior Task Force meetings may vote. Voting is based on the honor system.

How consensus is determined:

Consensus is reached when no one objects to the proposal moving forward.

("I can live with it" counts as consensus.)

If consensus is not reached:

A simple majority vote will decide the outcome.

How consensus votes are counted:

- The facilitator will announce the total number of eligible voters in the room.
- Voters may choose Yes, I can live with it, No, or Abstain.
- Abstentions count toward the total number of votes cast and therefore affect the threshold for a majority.

How Majority threshold votes are counted:

A proposal passes if more than 50% of votes cast (Yes + No + Abstain) are "Yes."

Order of Voting:

- 1. Authority Options (2) Select Option A, B, or C.
- 2. Amendments to Authority
- 3. Approval of Authority
- 4. Amendments to 1, 3, and 4.
- 5. Approval of 1, 3, and 4.

After the Vote:

- Approved changes will be incorporated into the final Recommendations.
- The final report will be submitted to the Anchorage Assembly per the ordinance.
