10 **AN ORDINANCE OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY**
11 **AMENDING AMC 2.40.030 RELATING TO THE DEFINITION AND**
12 **RECOGNITION OF COMMUNITY COUNCILS.**

15 The Anchorage Assembly Ordains:

16
17 **Section 1:** That Anchorage Municipal Code Section 2.40.030 is
18 amended as follows (other sections are not affected and therefore not set out):

20 **2.40.030 Definition and recognition of community councils.**
21

- 22 A. *Community councils defined.* Community councils are nonprofit,
23 voluntary, self-governing associations composed of residents,
24 property owners, business owners and representatives from
25 nonprofit associations and other entities located within
26 geographical areas designated as districts by the A[a]ssembly.
27 Residents, for the purpose of this chapter, are defined as
28 homeowners, tenants, or others dwelling within the council
29 boundaries [RESIDENTS], property owners and representatives
30 from nonprofit associations and other entities located within
31 geographical areas designated as districts by the assembly.
32
33 B. *Recognition of community councils.* Upon request of one or more
34 voluntary associations and after public notice and hearing, the
35 A[a]ssembly may recognize by ordinance any one voluntary
36 association as the community council for a given district. To qualify
37 for and maintain recognition, an association must establish that it:

39 1. m[M]eets the definition of a community council as set forth in
40 subsection A of this section;[.]
41
42 2. h[H]as a policy and practice of open membership and meetings
43 which encourages participation of persons from all segments of
44 the community;[.]

46 3. d[D]oes not charge dues, or require other financial contribution
47 as a condition of membership or participation, in excess of
48 \$15.00 ~~\$25.00~~ ~~[\$5.00]~~ per member per year; however, the

council may waive the required dues in individual instances if the council determines that a hardship exists; a community council [SUCH ORGANIZATION] may receive gifts, grants, contributions, or in-kind donations [OF MORE THAN \$250.00 PER MEMBER PER YEAR] from members or others to meet the cost of its operations;[.]

4. i[l]s, in the opinion of the A[a]ssembly representative of the residents in the district;[.]

5. h[H]as held at least two meetings in the district which resulted in a determination to seek recognition as a community council. such meetings must have ben subsequent to public notice through newspaper publication, school distribution and other means adequate to inform most, if not all , district residents of the meeting;[.] and

6. h[H]as adopted by-laws governing the organization, operation, and proceedings of the community council. These by-laws shall be presented to the Assembly prior to recognition and shall provide for:
 - a) Definition of the boundaries of the community councils as set forth in AMC 2.40.040 D and AMC 2.40.090.

 - b) Definition of membership consistent with A of this section.

 - c) Regular meetings of the council at periodic intervals, at least **two** four times in a calendar year, but preferably once each calendar quarter.

 - d) The election of officers and, if desired, an executive committee or like body to conduct the business of the council between meetings; however, any member of the council may request that an action of such a body be brought to a vote of the council at the next council meeting. [~~all council members must have an equal voice in policy decisions.~~]

 - e) The duties and responsibilities of officers, their removal or replacement when a vacancy occurs, and criteria for eligibility to hold an office with the council.

 - f) **Minutes shall be taken at all meetings. An annual report to the council members summarizing all councils**

business conducted in the preceding 12 months or a compilation of approved minutes.

g) The management of the council's finances including regular status reports and an annual report to the council members on the council's finances or a compilation of treasurer's reports.

h) The dissolution of the council, and for the disposition of the council's property upon dissolution.

i) That the latest edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Revised, shall apply in all instances, matters, and proceedings not covered by the by-laws.

j) Procedures for amending the by-laws.


k) Membership lists are used only for council business.

C. Girdwood is not considered a community council for purposes of this section.


Section 2: All community councils previously established under this section shall bring their bylaws into compliance and present those bylaws to the Assembly within 120 days of passage and approval of this ordinance.

Section 3: This ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval.
