What is the Gap Analysis and what is it used for?

- Data-informed decisions about where to invest in the solution to homelessness
- Allows community partners to start from the same base assumptions
- Required by HUD
- Calculation assumptions
 - Demand - Supply = Gap



Calculating Demand – Total Need

- The main source for demand calculation is the Built for Zero (BfZ) by-name list
- BfZ data allows for the delineation of demand into sub-populations (Single Adults, Families, Youth, Veteran)



Calculating Demand – Intervention Type

- The CoC uses a custom assessment tool to prioritize clients based on vulnerability.
- Vulnerability informs referral to appropriate housing/ program intervention
- The intervention type breakdown is applied to the total need to calculate the gap
- Further refined by subpopulation based on the number of clients in that subpopulation as reported in HMIS



Calculating Supply

- The Housing Inventory Count (HIC) is an annual count of the shelter and housing inventory available in the community.
- HIC inventory numbers are the initial source for calculating current supply in the Gap analysis
- Additional external data sources are used to refine the inventory count further
 - Shelters that are not year-round and new projects added within the year are contextualized in the analysis.

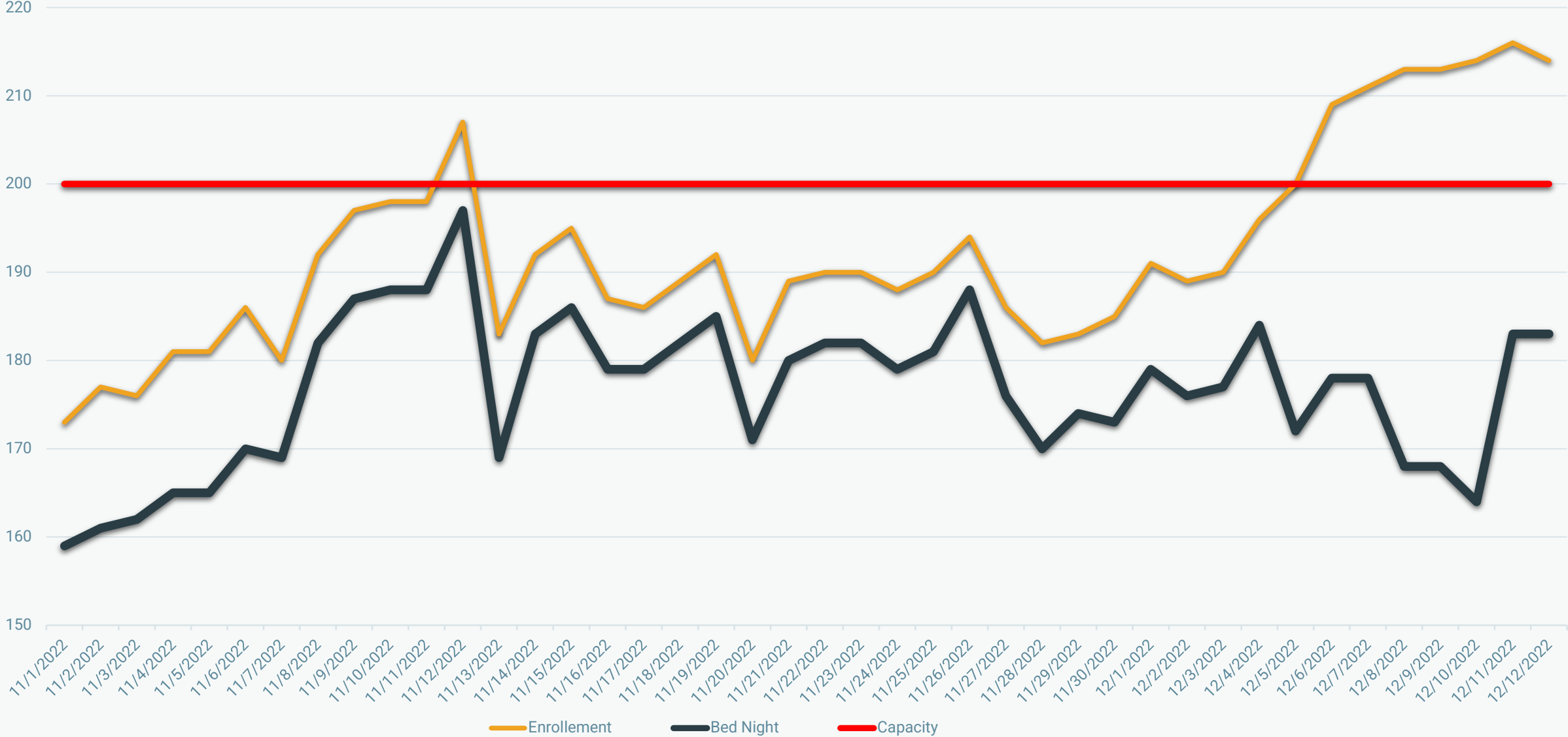

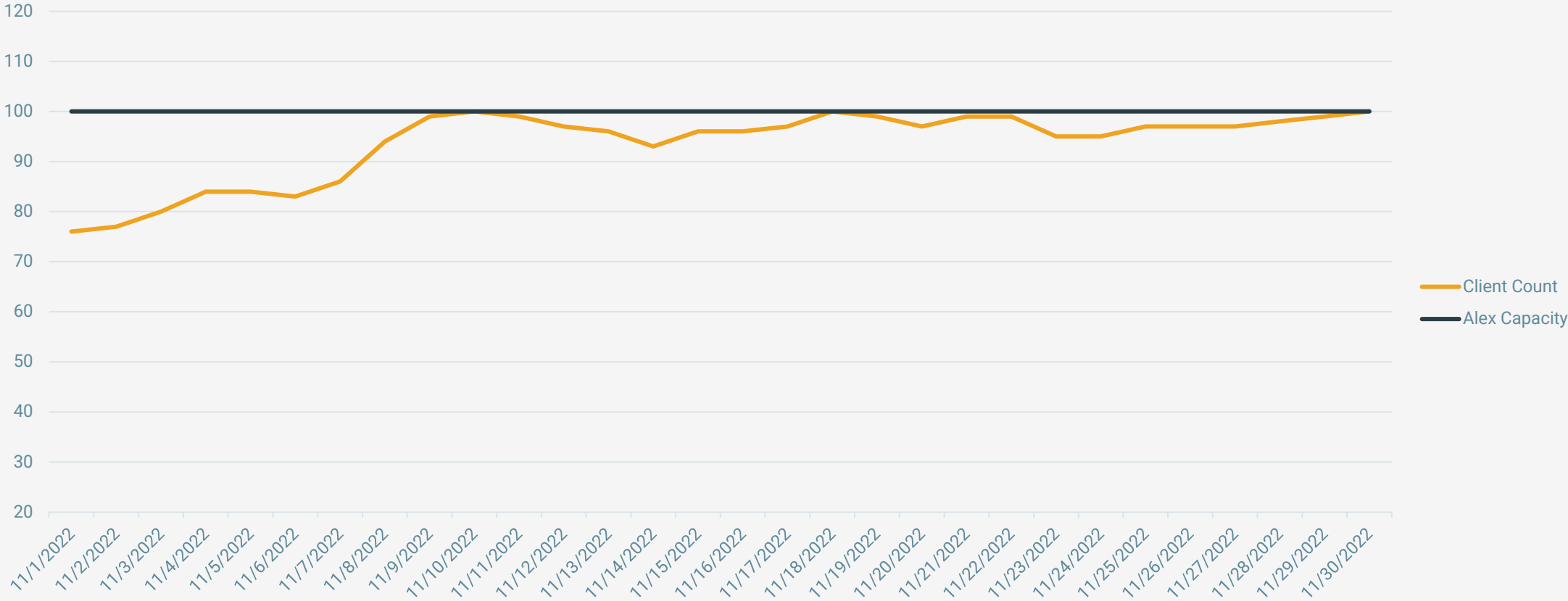


Sullivan Enrollment vs Bed Nights

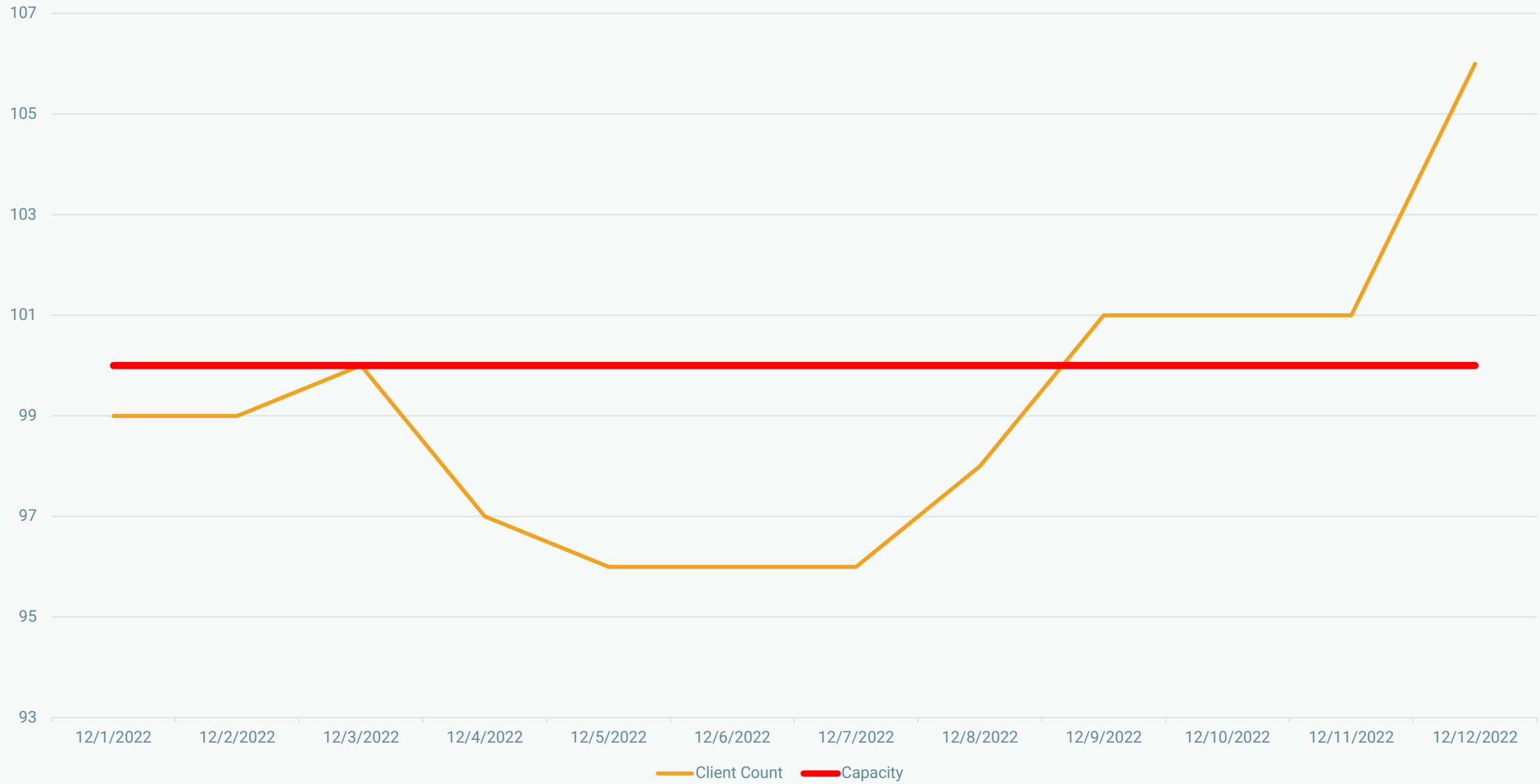


Alex Non-Congregate Shelter

Alex Capacity

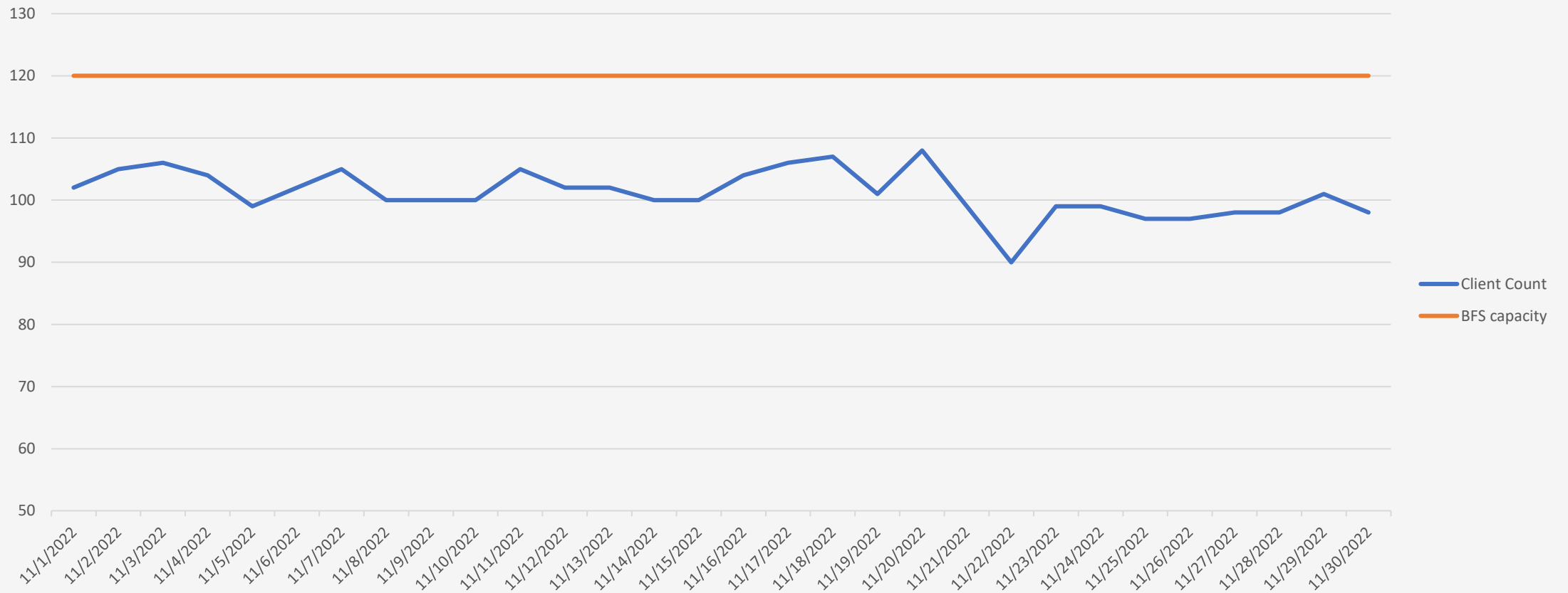


Alex Enrollment

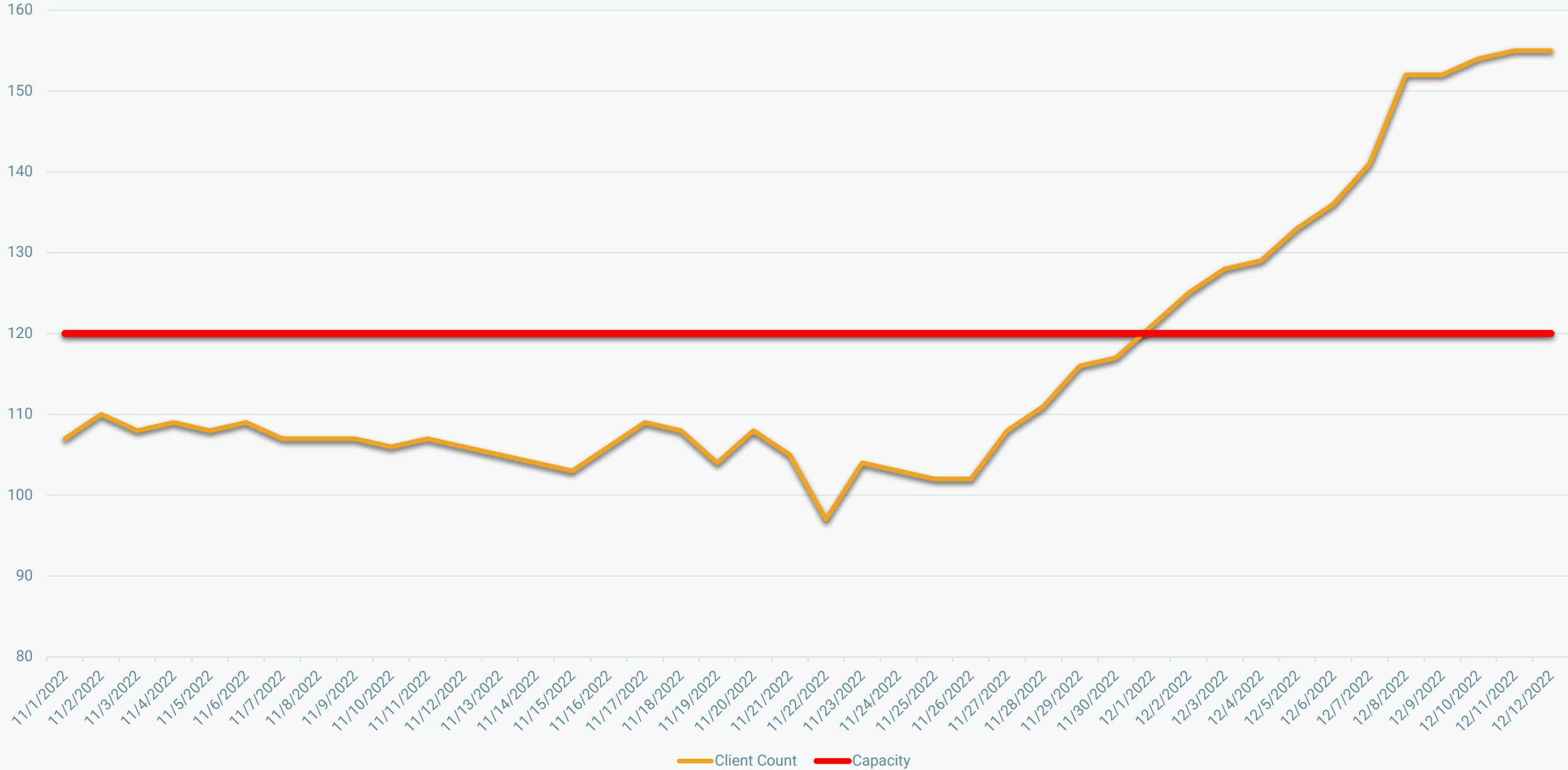


Brother Francis Shelter

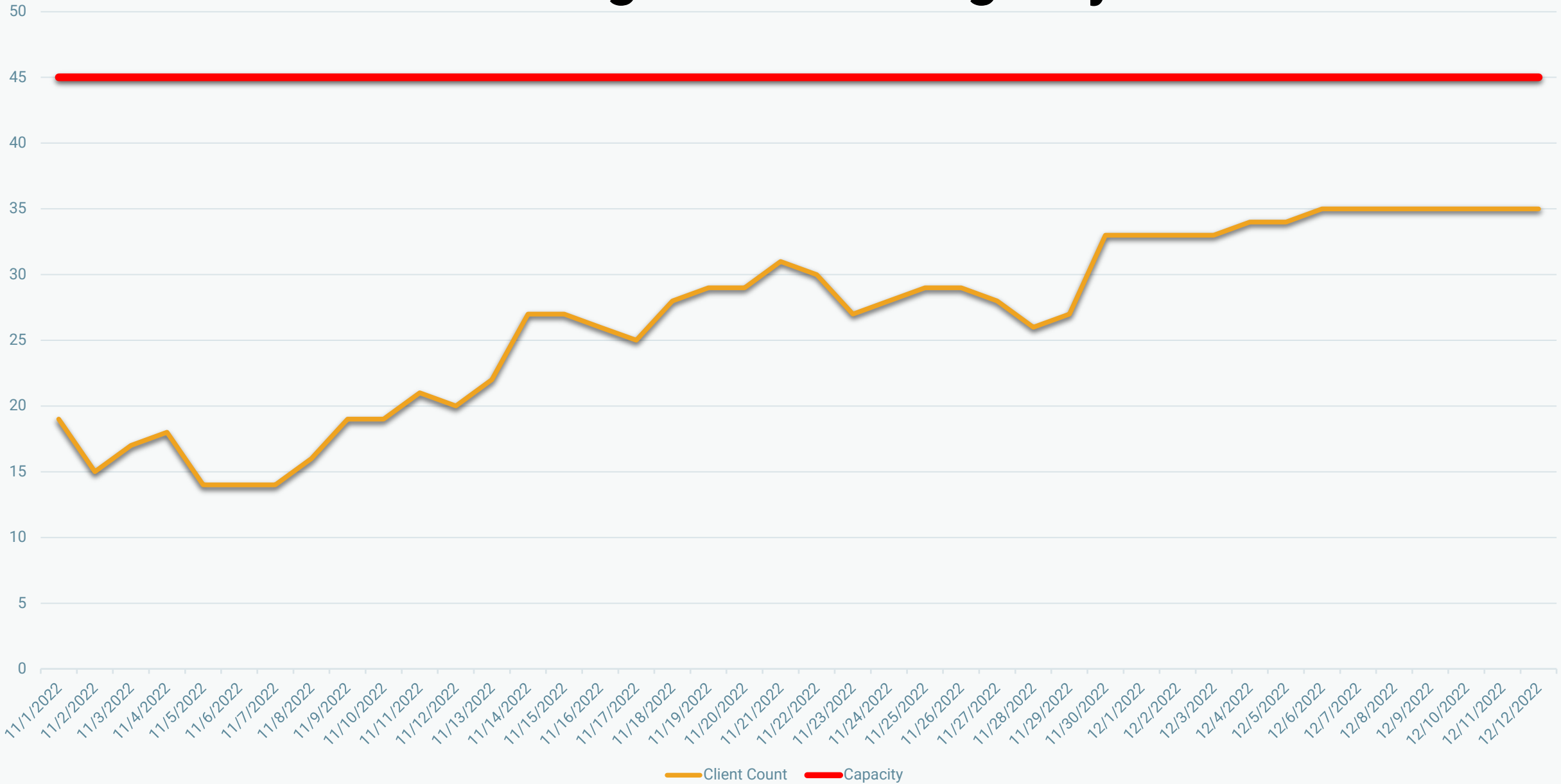
Brother Francis Shelter Capacity



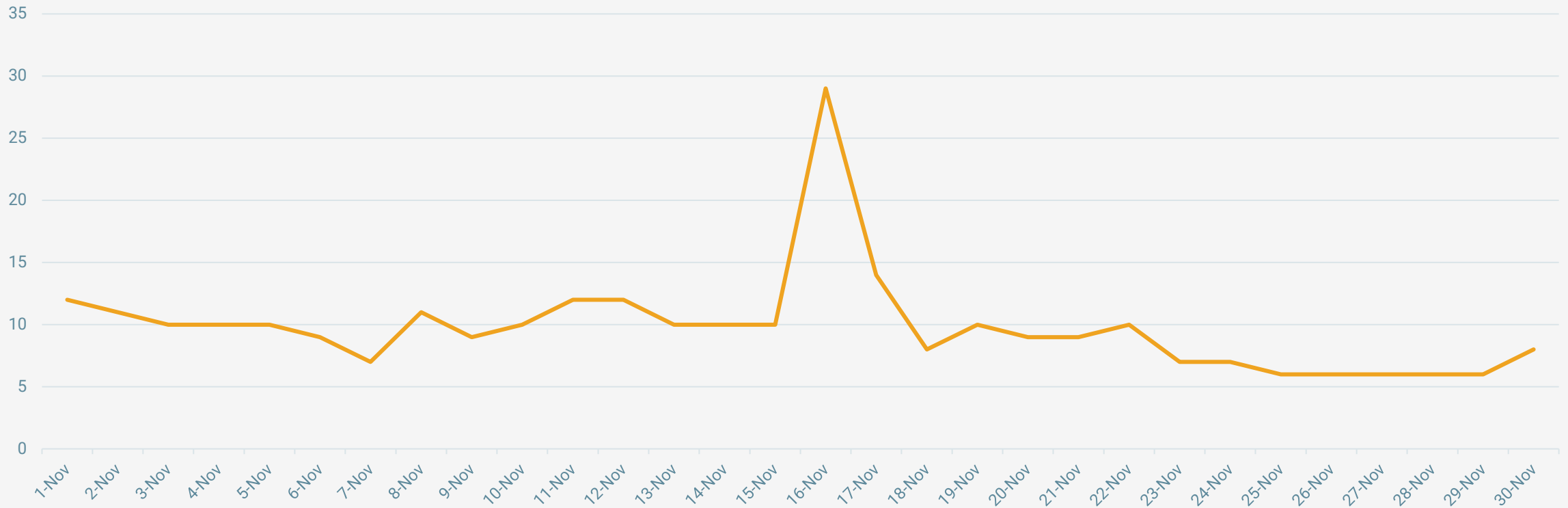
Brother Francis Enrollment



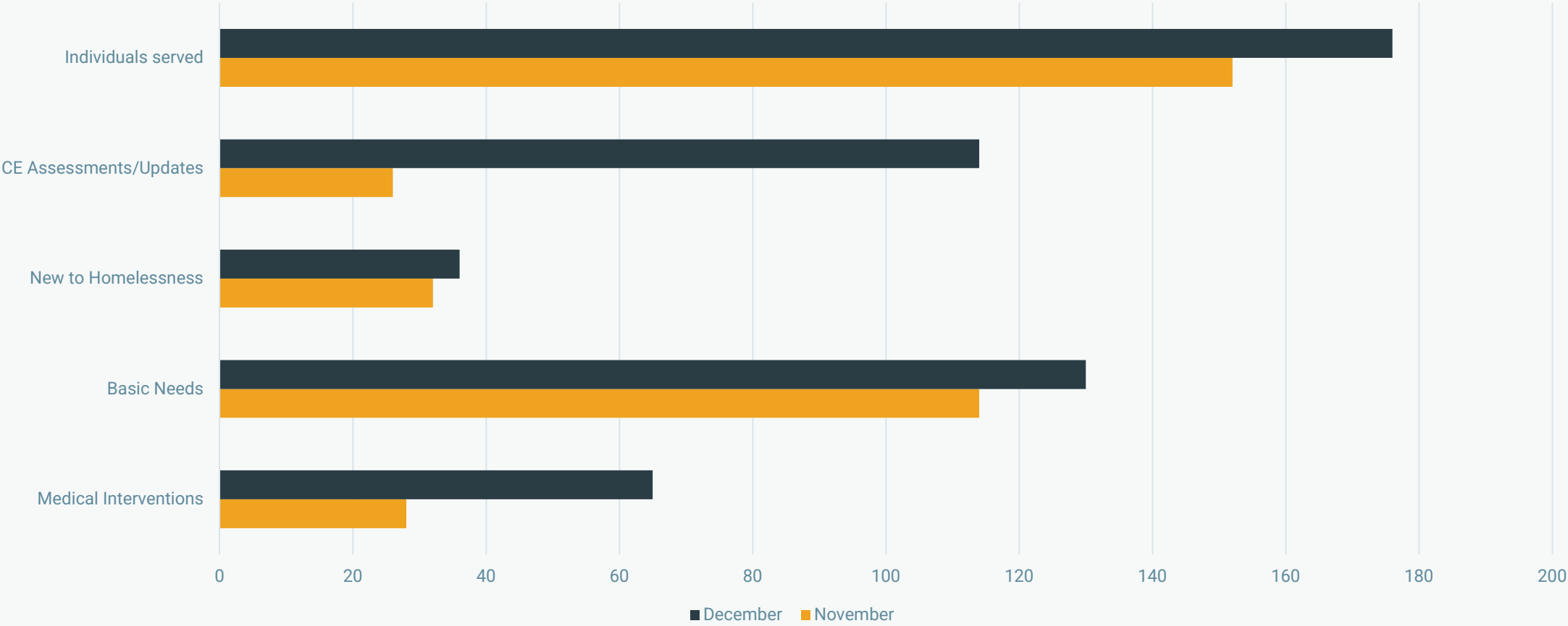
Transition-Age Youth Emergency Enrollment
