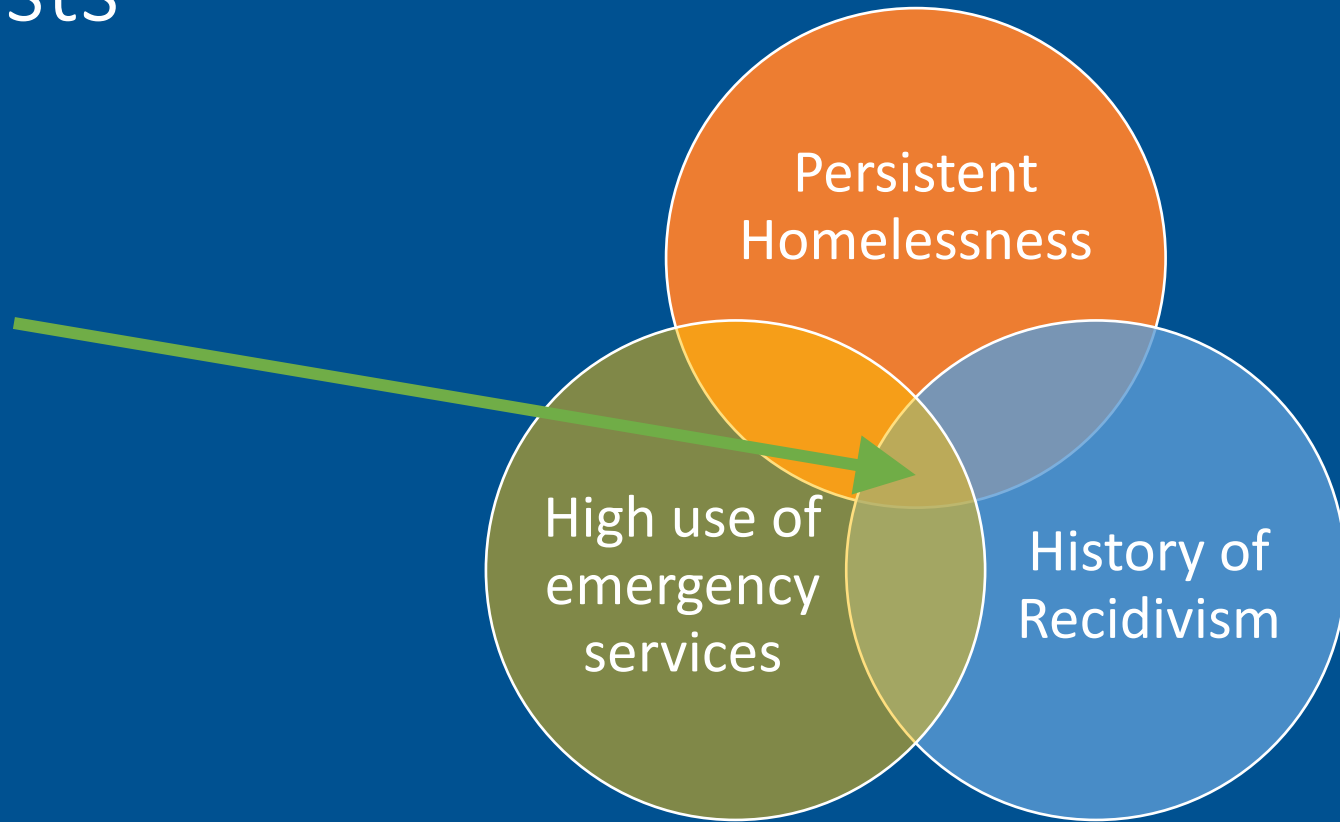

Anchorage identified PFS as potential solution due to intersection of high needs and high social costs

2019: Approx. 350 people in Anchorage; Today – nearly 900 people meet this criteria

(out of ~1,100 total homeless)¹

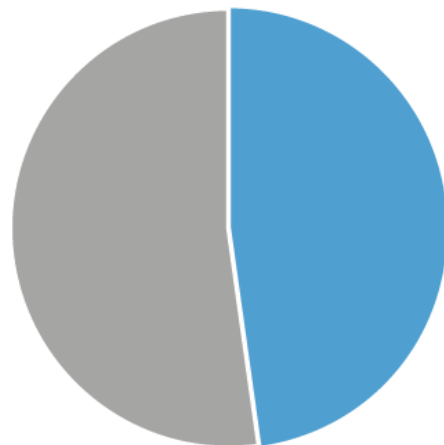

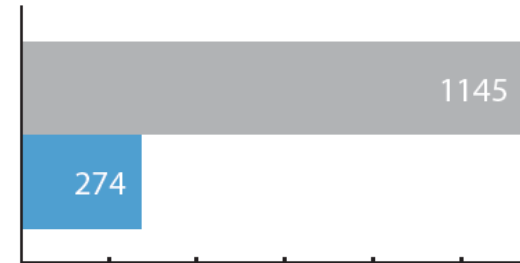

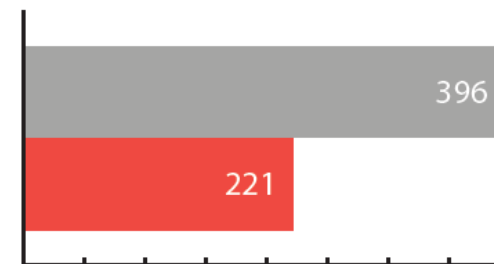

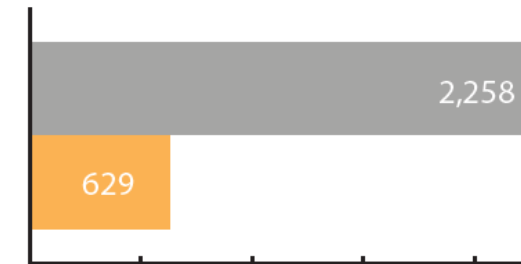
