The Municipal Clerk's Office is grateful to the 650 election workers, the many Municipal employees and others who assist our office for Municipal Elections.

The Clerk's Office has determined the timeline and process for the review and counting the absentee and questioned ballots. The municipal code provides that the review of absentee ballots may commence seven days prior to the election and allows for the counting of these ballots once the polls close. The municipal code provides that the review of the questioned ballot envelopes begins the day after the election. The Election Commission and other election officials have begun the review of ballots and will continue the review from approximately 8:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. in City Hall, in Suite 105 or 155. The review will continue Monday-Friday, and possibly Saturdays, until completed.

On Election Night, the Election Commission along with Election Officials will count all Absentee By-Mail ballots received by Election Day and will also count all Absentee In Person ballots cast between March 23, 2015 and March 31, 2015. The count will take place in City Hall, Suite 155.

The public is welcome to attend. The Municipal Clerk's office will provide updates to the timeline and processes for the review of ballots.

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
