REMINDER: SPECIAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION ACCESSIBLE VOTE CENTER IS OPEN

August 3, 2018

The Municipal Clerk's Office reminds Assembly District 3 - West Anchorage voters that the Special Municipal Election Accessible Vote Center (AVC) will be open for voting and voting assistance tomorrow, Saturday, August 4 from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. The AVC is located at the MOA Election Center at 619 East Ship Creek Avenue at the Door D entrance. An interactive map with the location of the AVC may be found at muni.org/elections/AVC.

The AVC will also be open for voting on Monday, August 6 from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m., and on Election Day, Tuesday, August 7 from 7:00 a.m. – 8:00 p.m.

The MOA Election Center AVC offers the following services, where voters can:

- Vote in-person
- Return a mailed ballot
- Receive voting assistance
- Vote a questioned or provisional ballot
- Get help with other voter questions

Voters who are voting in-person will be required to show identification. Acceptable identification includes:

- Alaska driver's license
- State of Alaska ID
- Passport
- Hunting or fishing license
- Voter registration card
- Other identification allowed in state elections

The only race on the Special Municipal Election ballot is Assembly District 3 - West Anchorage, Seat E. Only voters with a residence address in Assembly District 3 may cast a ballot in the election. Voters may find their Assembly District by entering their address on the interactive Assembly District Map at muni.org/AssemblyDistrictMap or voters may contact the Voter Hotline at (907)243-VOTE(8683).

The Municipal Clerk's Office reminds voters that traditional polling locations will not be open for voting on Election Day, August 7, 2018. Ballot packages were mailed to qualified, registered voters in Assembly District 3 - West Anchorage on July 17, 2018 - three weeks before Election Day. Voters have the opportunity to study the ballot with trusted resources, mark their choice, sign the voter declaration, and return their ballot by Secure Drop Box, AVC, or by mailing through the USPS. If a voter did not receive their ballot package in the mail, they are encouraged to visit the AVC in order to vote.
