AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED TEN MILLION DOLLARS (\$10,000,000)OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF CHUGACH ACCESS CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE CHUGACH STATE PARK ACCESS SERVICE AREA, AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAY ASSOCIATED OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COSTS IN THE CHUGACH STATE PARK ACCESS SERVICE AREA, AT THE ELECTION TO BE HELD IN THE MUNICIPALITY ON APRIL 2, 2024.

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WHEREAS, the best interests of the citizens and property owners in the Chugach State Park Access Service Area serving the Municipality of Anchorage, Alaska (the "Municipality") require the Municipality to acquire, construct, renovate, upgrade and undertake certain Chugach State Park access improvements, which may include road and parking improvements, park access, and park-access-supporting amenities, all as more particularly described in the Assembly Memorandum submitted with this ordinance (the "Projects");

WHEREAS, in order to provide financing for the Projects, it is deemed necessary and advisable that the Municipality issue and sell its general obligation bonds (the "Bonds"); and

WHEREAS, the 2024 General Government Capital Improvement Budget (CIB) shall be revised to include the any changes necessitated by or as reflected in this ordinance; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

<u>Section 1.</u> Purpose. The Assembly hereby determines that the Projects are needed throughout the Municipality. The Assembly hereby determines that the best interest of the residents and property owners within the Municipality require the Municipality to undertake the Projects at the time and in the order and in the manner deemed most necessary and advisable by the Municipality. The estimated cost of the Projects, including incidental costs and costs related to issuing and selling the Bonds as provided in this ordinance, is estimated to be \$10,000,000 [or some other amount to be inserted by Assembly amendment].

The Projects are described in more detail in the attachment to the Assembly Memorandum accompanying this ordinance. The cost of all necessary planning, acquisition of property for, site preparation, construction, installing and equipping of

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the Projects, architectural, engineering, design, and other consulting services, inspection and testing, administrative expenses, costs of issuance of the Bonds and other costs incurred in connection with the Projects shall be deemed to be costs of the approved Projects. The approved Projects may be completed with all necessary equipment and appurtenances.

The Municipality shall determine the application of available moneys between the various Projects so as to accomplish, as nearly as may be, the Projects described or provided for in this section.

If the Municipality shall determine that it has become impractical to accomplish any portion of the approved Projects by reason of changed conditions or needs, incompatible development or costs substantially in excess of those estimated, the Municipality shall not be required to accomplish such portions and shall apply Bond proceeds as set forth in this section.

If the approved Projects have been completed in whole or in part, or their completion duly provided for, or its completion found to be impractical, the Municipality may apply Bond proceeds or any portion thereof to other Municipality Chugach State Park Access Service Area projects at its sole discretion. Otherwise, the Municipality shall apply such remaining proceeds solely to payment of principal or interest on the Bonds, as provided in the Home Rule Charter. In the event that the proceeds of sale of the Bonds, plus any other monies of the Municipality legally available, are insufficient to accomplish the approved Projects, the Municipality shall use the available funds for paying the cost of those portions of the approved Projects deemed by the Municipality most necessary and in the best interest of the Municipality. No Bond proceeds shall be used by the Municipality for any purpose other than a capital improvement of the Municipality.

For the purpose of providing funds for the undertaking of the Projects, which are hereby found to be a public purpose and in the public interest, the Municipality hereby proposes to issue general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed ten million dollars [or some other amount to be inserted by Assembly amendment] (\$10,000,000 [or some other amount to be inserted by Assembly amendment]).

Section 2. Details of Bonds. The Bonds shall be sold in such amounts and at such time or times as deemed necessary and advisable by the Assembly and as permitted by law and shall mature over a period of up to 20 years from date of issue. The Bonds shall be issued in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$10,000,000 [or some other amount to be inserted by Assembly amendment]. The Bonds shall bear interest to be fixed at the time of sale or sales thereof. The exact form, terms, conditions, contents, security, options of redemption, and such other matters relating to the issuance and sale of said Bonds as are deemed necessary and advisable by the Assembly shall be as hereinafter determined and/or delegated by ordinance and/or resolution of the Assembly.

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The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the Bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal and interest on the Bonds when due.

Section 3. Ballot Proposition. The Assembly hereby submits to the qualified voters of the Municipality the proposition of whether or not the Municipality should issue the Bonds for the purpose of financing the costs of the approved Projects at the regular municipal election to be held on April 2, 2024.

The Clerk shall prepare the ballot proposition to be submitted to the voters as provided by this ordinance and the Municipal Code and shall perform all necessary steps in accordance with law to place this proposition before the voters at the regular election. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting, both in the Chugach State Park Access Service Area and areawide, on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

CHUGACH STATE PARK ACCESS SERVICE AREA PARK-ACCESS BONDS

For the purpose of providing improved Chugach State including Park access, road and parking improvements, park-access improvements, and parkaccess-supporting capital amenities, including those located near Upper DeArmoun/Canyon Road; Basher and Campbell Airstrip Road; Honey Bear Lane and Circle, Snow Bear Drive and Kings Way; and the Stewart Homestead Trail or otherwise in or near the South Goldenview Rural Road Service Area; and related capital improvements in Anchorage as provided in AO 2023- , shall Anchorage borrow money and issue up to \$10,000,000 [or some other amount to be inserted by Assembly amendment in principal amount of general obligation bonds?

Voter approval of this bond proposition authorizes for each \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value (based on the estimated 2023 assessed valuation in the Chugach State Park Access Service Area): (i) an annual increase in taxes of approximately \$[to be inserted by Assembly amendment to retire the proposed bonds, and (ii) an annual increase in the municipal tax cap (Charter 14.03(b)(2))

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE

The attached ordinance will place a general obligation bond proposition for the Chugach State Park Access Service Area (CASA) on the ballot for the regular Municipal election to be held on April 2, 2024.

The CASA bond proposal will implement the priorities established in the 2024-2029 Capital Improvement Program, as amended. Please see the attached Project List, attached as Exhibit A.

This item is being introduced early, to ensure that it receives adequate attention in the annual capital-budget and ballot-proposition processes. It is recommended that it be scheduled for a public hearing later this fall.

Early introduction is designed to ensure adequate time for community consideration and consensus, and to allow adequate time for conversation and coordination with affected road service areas.

Because this ordinance is being submitted early, a final project list with refined project-cost estimates is not yet available. It is anticipated that estimates will be developed ahead of assembly action on the ordinance, so that the final list of projects and associated costs can be finalized by Assembly amendment, or by introduction of an s-version of the ordinance.

As a point of reference, a list of projects requiring approximately \$10 million in new borrowing would likely require, for each \$100,000 of assessed taxable property value in the CASA, an annual increase in taxes of less than \$3 per year to retire the proposed bonds.

I request your support of the attached ordinance.
