Committee Description

Updated description, adopted 8-3-23

The Assembly Legislative Committee provides guidance to the Assembly and the Administration and recommendations regarding the Municipality's federal, state, and local legislative priorities. The Committee prepares recommendations for the Municipality's six-year capital program and budget priorities, as well as **potential statute changes**, and collaborates with the Administration to create the Anchorage Legislative Program submitted annually to the State Legislature. The Committee also serves as a forum for review and deliberation of statute changes and other legislation and policies that impact the Municipality, and Anchorage as a whole. Individual members may work with the committee on communication of district-level priorities and engaging with other levels of government.

2023 Goals

The committee's work directly contributes to achieving these 3 broader goals.

- 1. Administration and Assembly work collaboratively to develop Leg. Program with shared priorities, and which are strategic and focused to our needs.
- Approve 2024 Legislative Program at November 21 or December 5, 2023 regular meeting.
 Code requirements: Program must be <u>introduced</u> before the budget is passed, and must be <u>passed</u> by December 10
- 3. Assembly and Mayor jointly host the Anchorage Delegation for a working lunch to present and discuss the Municipality's legislative priorities.
