2019 Homelessness Summer Community Count



### SUMMER COMMUNITY COUNT PROCEDURES

Count Date: August 19-23, 2019 (3<sup>rd</sup> week of August)

A count is taken through the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) of everyone who comes into shelters across the community over the course of the week.

All names are unduplicated if a person stayed more than one day in shelter or stayed in more than one shelter

Certain hotel stays or short-term apartment stays can be counted as shelter if a non-profit is paying for the stay

A count of every person who came in for food at a kitchen location on designated days within the same week: Bean's Café, Downtown Hope Center, Anchorage Gospel Rescue Mission

APD Community Action Policing team conducts a canvas of all locations identified by community input in the GIS map for reporting homeless camps.

Other service locations are surveyed – i.e. day drop-in centers, libraries

Street corners and common locations where homeless people gather are canvassed

All lists from the above sources are compared and unduplicated if a person was found in one or more location

## 2019 saw an increase - WHY?


- August 19-23 was nearly two months into the state budget crisis
- Increases were observed in the number of people contacting United Way's 2-1-1 assistance line
- Funding that has been available for many years to help with rental assistance or prevention of homelessness was not available
- Seniors and people receiving state assistance did not receive checks for several months
- Many new people were observed coming into food kitchens
- Resources to help people move out of homelessness have been stagnant or reduced in the State FY2020 budget

- Downtown Hope Center meal program
- Anchorage Gospel Rescue Mission meal program
- Alaska Mental Health Consumer Web
- Covenant House Drop-In
- Camps/Street Corners
- Library (2019 only)

### **Purple** = Shelters, all populations:

- Catholic Social Services, Brother Francis Shelter
- Downtown Hope Center, women only shelter
- Covenant House, youth shelter
- Catholic Social Services, Clare House family shelter
- Salvation Army, McKinnell House family shelter
- Partner's Re-Entry Center hotel vouchers (2019)
- Anchorage Gospel Rescue Mission shelter
- AWAIC domestic violence shelter



## SUMMER AND WINTER COUNTS ARE NOT EQUAL

- Can be used generally for comparison of the total persons and the overall needs of the safety net across two different seasons
- Different methods of collecting data need to be implemented in summer when people are more difficult to see through foliage and are more spread out across the community
  - Winter: One day in January
  - Summer: One week in August
- More "in" and "out-flow" is captured with people moving between shelters and community settings across the week in August



persons found on street corners/pan handling (homeless)persons found in camps




# Anchorage Winter Homeless Counts Point In Time 2013-2019
