



EXTENSION OF 1984 WATER SUPPLY AGREEMENT

April 16, 2026

Background

- The Eklutna Power Project Owners (CEA, MEA, AHU) own the priority water rights for all flows into Eklutna Lake; AWWU has a State permit to use some of their water for public water supply.
- The Alaska Power Administration and the Municipality of Anchorage entered into the 1984 Agreement to set the terms for the Municipality's use of Eklutna Lake water, including access and compensation.
- The 1984 Agreement originally ran through 2025 but was extended to June 1, 2026, by a previous agreement between AWWU and the current Eklutna Power Project Owners.

Proposed Extension Agreement

- The parties want to extend the 1984 Agreement again on a short-term basis to preserve the status quo.
- The proposed extension agreement continues the 1984 Agreement as is until the earlier of February 29, 2028, or a prescribed period following resolution of the major remaining issues about the method of rewatering the Eklutna River.
- No changes during the term of this extension to the amount of water supplied or the compensation paid for the water.
- AWWU will bring this extension to the Assembly later this month so it can be considered before the 1984 Agreement expires.
