Whether it's a mental health concern, a substance use issue, a medical emergency, or someone in need of connection to services we're creating a coordinated response that meets people where they are.

This system includes multiple departments and community partners, from the Anchorage Fire Department @anchoragefiredept, Health Department @ancpublichealth , and Police Department @anchoragepolice to pre-trial diversion programs and outreach teams.

Together, they're offering compassionate, specialized care that goes beyond traditional emergency response.

If you see someone in crisis and aren't sure who to call start with 3-1-1. Our teams will take it from there.




