**A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY
ESTABLISHING A PUBLIC DELIBERATIVE PROCESS FOR DEVELOPING A
PLAN FOR USE AND BUDGETING OF NEW TAX REVENUE SOURCES
DEDICATED TO SPECIFIC PURPOSES.**

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly has before it for consideration at its January 28, 2020 regular meeting three proposals for new tax revenues, each that dedicates the net receipts from the tax to specific public purposes: (1) AO 2019-148(S-1) proposing a retail sales tax on alcoholic beverages, (2) AO 2019-148(S-2) also proposing a retail sales tax on alcoholic beverages with different dedication purposes, and (3) AO 2019-156(S-1) proposing a general retail sales tax; and

WHEREAS, the dedication clauses of each proposal are worded to describe subject areas for expenditure of the new revenue, appropriate high-level policy directives for amendment to the Home Rule Charter of Anchorage; and

WHEREAS, some comments and reactions from stakeholders and the public to the tax revenue proposals demonstrate a [~~common~~] desire to have more detailed plans for specific programs, services, grants, or capital improvements on which the dedicated revenues will be spent; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly in its legislative capacity has the taxation power and can establish public policy, but will benefit from engagement with the public, subject matter experts, and stakeholders in a deliberative process to develop a budget plan for the proposed new tax revenue prior to the FY2021 Budget process; now, therefore,

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY RESOLVES:

Section 1. If the people of Anchorage vote to approve a new revenue source on the April 2020 election ballot, t[he] Assembly commits to hold no less than a work session or a relevant committee meeting every other month with the purposes of:

- identifying needs within the dedicated fund sources, including specific evaluation of the needs in Chugiak, Eagle River, and Girdwood areas;
- prioritizing the needs within the dedicated fund sources;
- gathering specific information on identified needs as well as recommended actions and/or interventions from stakeholders and subject matter experts and the expected outcomes and length of proposed action or intervention;
- evaluation of other funding sources already being utilized to address the identified needs and whether Municipal funds are duplicative or can be

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leveraged with those funding sources to achieve the expected outcomes;
and

- utilizing information from stakeholders and subject matter experts to determine the costs of proposed actions, associated with the identified actions and/or interventions.

Section 2. The Assembly commits to hold no less than 3 town hall meetings in Anchorage, Chugiak/Eagle River, and Girdwood in advance of public hearings on the FY2021 budget.

Section 3. Once programs, services, or capital projects are identified for funding the Assembly shall:

- for non-Municipal services or projects, require competitive solicitations pursuant to Anchorage Municipal Code Title 7. The solicitations will be developed in collaboration with subject matter experts and contain appropriate performance measures and oversight by the Municipality.
- for Municipal services, biennial reporting at the appropriate committee, including evaluative metrics.


Section 4. This resolution shall be effective immediately upon passage and approval by the Assembly.
