Responded to 207 disasters statewide, providing assistance including comfort kits, financial assistance, and additional resources to 812 Alaskans.



Supported by 475 Alaskan volunteers, who provided disaster relief assistance, training services, preparedness, and event support.



Made 426 Alaskan homes safer from home fires, and installed 1,096 free smoke alarms in communities all around the state.



Enrolled 14,346 Alaskans in CPR, AED, First Aid, water safety, and preparedness training courses online and in-person.



Provided 17,150 services to members of the military, veterans, and their families in Alaska including emergency messaging and health & wellness.
