AN ORDINANCE OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AMENDING AND CONSOLIDATING AMENDMENTS TO PAVING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT 8P79-NORTHEAST TURNAGAIN PAVING AND RESOLVING TO CONFIRM AND LEVY SPECIAL ASSESSMENTS FOR STREET AND STREET LIGHT IMPROVEMENTS ON PROPERTY SPECIALLY BENEFITED IN PAVING SPECIAL ASSESSMENT DISTRICT 8P79 AND SETTING THE DATE OF ASSESSMENT INSTALLMENT PAYMENTS, INTEREST ON UNPAID ASSESSMENTS, AND PROVIDING FOR PENALTIES AND INTEREST IN THE EVENT OF DELINQUENCY.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY FINDS:

Section 1. On November 13, 1979, a Public Hearing was conducted by the Municipal Assembly for AO No. 79-193 concerning a petition for creation of a Special Assessment District to construct standard residential paved streets with rolled curbs and gutters in the Northeast Turnagain Area (refer to attached map). The following described properties were included in the petition:

Proposed Benefited Properties by Petition

Lots 1 and 1A of Lyn Ary Homesite Subdivision; Lots 1 and 2 of Power Subdivision; Lots 0, 1 through 11, and 42 through 45, Tract A, and Lots 13B, 18B, 19A, through 25A, 29C, 30C, 34B, 33A, 36B, 37B, 39A, 40A, and 41A, Block A-2 of Turnagain Heights Subdivision and the Lyn Ary Park Site..

Section 2. At the conclusion of the Public Hearing on November 13, 1979, the Municipal Assembly amended and approved Ordinance 79-193. The first amendment excluded lots from the RID that are above the bluff line and do not have access to the streets proposed for improvement. The effect of this amendment deleted Lots 13B, 34B, 35A, 36B, and 37B of Block A-2 of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision as property specially benefited by the assessment district. The second amendment deleted Lot 29C, Block A-2 of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision.

Section 3. On February 26, 1985, the Municipal Assembly amended and approved AO No. 85-25 which ordained:

3.A That the Lyn Ary Park and Lots 42, 43, 44 and 45 of Tract A of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision be deleted as property specially benefited from the assessment district.

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46 ! 3.B That Section 3 of the original ordinance, AO 79-193, in which the assessable cost of the project, be described as the lesser amount of (1) contract costs plus twenty percent (20%) for non-contract costs or (2) the last approved estimate plus ten percent (10%), be repealed and the full cost of the improvements as authorized under AO 79-193 be assessed to the benefited parcels, notwithstanding Anchorage Municipal Code 19.30.040.

3.C That property owners bearing more than fifty percent (50%) of the new estimated cost, as revised by AO 85-25, approve the continuation of the district.

Section 4. On April 18, 1985, property owners representing over fifty percent (50%) of the revised estimated cost approved a petition to continue with the district.

Section 5. On July 21, 1987 the Municipal Assembly amended and accepted AIM 209-87 to establish a geotechnical study and provided that the owners, by agreement, be required to reimburse the Municipality the cost of the study, not to exceed \$100,000.

Section 6. As of December 7, 1990, property owners approved a petition to continue with the district, which contained revised estimated costs based upon an actual bid to construct the project. Additionally, property owners who represented over fifty percent (50%) of the cost petitioned to have street lights included as an improvement with the residential streets.

Section 7. On April 25, 1991, the plat of Turnagain NE (Plat Number 91-19) was filed with the State of Alaska District Recorder. Owners representing twenty-four (24) lots executed and signed the replat. This replat re-designated Lots 1 and 1A of Lyn Ary Homesite Subdivision; Lots 1 and 2 of Power Subdivision; Lots 0, and 1 through 11 of Tract A, and Lots 18B, 20A, 21A, 24A, 25A, 39A, 40A, and 41A, Block A-2 of Turnagain Heights Subdivision, to Lots 1A-1, 2A-1-1, 1B-1, 1C-1, 0A-1, 1A-2-1, 2A-2-1, 3A-1, 4A-1, 5A-1, 6A-1, 7A-1, 8A-1, 9A-1, 10A-1, 11A-1 of Block A, and Lots 18C-1, 20B-1, 21B-1, 24B-1, 25B-1, 39B-1, 40B-1, 41B-1, of Block A-2, of Turnagain NE.

Section 8. On May 8, 1992, Plat Number 92-34 was filed with the State of Alaska District Recorder, in which Lots 24B-1

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and 25B-1, Block A-2, Turnagain NE were replatted into Lot 25B-2, Block A-2, Turnagain NE.

the 1992, September 15, On: Section 9. deleted which 92-112 and approved AO No. Assembly amended District 8P79. After Lot 25B-2, Block A-2, Turnagain NE from being vetoed by the Mayor, the Assembly overrode the veto on September 22, 1992.

Section 10. On December 17, 1993, the final pay estimate for the contract, to construct the improvements in the Northeast Turnagain Area, was executed between the contractor and the Department of Public Works.

Section 11. On April 29, 1994 Plat Number 94-48 was filed with the State of Alaska District Recorder, in which Lots 9A-1, 10A-1, and 11A-1, Block A, Turnagain NE were replatted into Lot 10B, Block A, Turnagain NE Subdivision.

Section 12. See amendment on page 7. NOW THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

- That the property currently described in Subsection (A) has been deleted from Special Assessment District 8P79, and any assessments for those properties will be borne by the currently described property in subsection (B).
- Properties deleted from Special Assessment District 8p79 include: Lots 42, 43, 44A an 45A, of Tract A, and Block A-2 of the Lots 13B, 29C, 34B, 35A, 36B, and 37B of Turnagain Heights Subdivision; and Lot 25B-2, Block A-2, of Turnagain NE and the Lyn Ary Park.
- Special assessed for Properties 1.B District 8P79 include: Lots 1A-1, 2A-1-1, 1B-1, 1C-1, 0A-1, 1A-2-1, 2A-2-1, 3A-1, 4A-1, 5A-1, 6A-1, 7A-1, 8A-1, 10B, of Block A, and Lots 18C-1, 20B-1, 21B-1, 39B-1, 40B-1, 41B-1, of Block A-2, of Turnagain NE; and Lot 19B, of Turnagain NE Plat of 86-74; and Lots 22A, 23A and 30C of Block A-2, of the Heights Subdivision.

That the public improvement described in the Section 2. findings of Section 1 of AO 79-193 is hereby repealed and reenacted as follows:

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A petition for creation of a Special Assessment District, and petitions for the continuation of the Special and proper signed by sufficient Assessment District were A petition to add street lights to the Special petitioners. Assessment District was signed by sufficient and proper petitioners. An agreement to conduct a geotechnical study was entered into with authorized by the Municipal Assembly and property owners on a voluntary basis. A replat was signed by property owners on a voluntary basis and recorded. The purpose of the petitions, agreement and replat was to construct standard residential streets, with curbs and gutters and street lights, on Turnagain Parkway from McCollie Avenue to Marston Drive, from Turnagain Parkway to Loussac Drive and Drive Susitna View Court from Turnagain Parkway to its west end, to confirm the soil stability of the area with a geotechnical study, and confirm property lines through the replat process.

Section 3. Section 4 of AO 85-25 is repealed and reenacted as follows:

- 3.A Costs assessed for street paving, curbs and gutters shall be:
- (1) the actual construction cost plus twenty percent (20%) for non-onstruction costs, and
- (2) municipal costs in excess of twenty percent (20%) identified as prorated cost of the street improvements constructed.
- 3.B Costs assessed for street lights shall be the construction cost plus twenty percent (20%) for non-construction costs.
- 3.C Costs assessed for the geotechnical study shall be \$100,000 and shall be assessed to the property of the owners who signed the agreement to reimburse the Municipality.
- 3.D Costs assessed for the replat shall be the actual costs required to complete the replat and shall be assessed to owners who signed the replat.

3.E. The assessable costs shall be reduced \$300,282.60.

Section 4. Section 4 of AO 79-193 is repealed and reenacted as follows:

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50 51 52 Assessments levied pursuant to this ordinance shall be calculated in the following manner:

- 4.A Assessments levied for street improvements shall be calculated in accordance with Title 19 in effect at the time of approval of AO 79-193.
- 4.B Assessments levied for street lights shall be calculated on a basis proportional to the area of the lots fronting the streets that were improved. The Assembly finds that assessments for street lights calculated on this basis are proportionate to the benefit received from and the burden imposed upon the improvement.
- 4.C Assessments levied for the geotechnical study shall be levied to the property of the owners who entered into the agreement to reimburse the Municipality for the study on an equal basis, in which each property shall be levied the same assessment. The Assembly finds that assessments for the study calculated on this basis are proportionate to the benefit received from and the burden imposed upon the improvement.
- 4.D Assessments levied for the replat shall be calculated on an area basis proportional to each lot replatted. The Assembly finds that assessments for the replat calculated on this basis are proportionate to the benefit received from and the burden imposed upon the improvement.
- Section 5. The improvements authorized under this Ordinance are hereby deemed complete. Special assessments are hereby levied against the lots and tracts specially benefited by the said improvements as set forth in the attached assessment roll prepared for the district.
- Section 6. Timely notice was sent to each property owner whose property was specially benefited by the improvements as indicated on the assessment roll, and each property owner was given notice of a public hearing before the Assembly for the purpose of giving the property owners an opportunity to present objections to the roll by showing errors and inequalities and by submitting any reason for amending or correcting the assessment roll for the Paving Special Assessment District No. 8P79 Northeast Turnagain Paving, Street Lights, Geotechnical Study and Replat.

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Section 7. In conformance with the notice to the property owners, the Assembly held a hearing on April 7, 1998 hear objections to the roll by property owners. hearing, all errors and inequalities to which valid objections and the amounts were corrected if any, were raised, indicated on said special assessment roll the amounts are finally determined to be assessed and which are equal to or less than the special benefit to each property accruing from the improvements constructed in said special assessment district. The assessment roll has been duly certified by the clerk. Special assessments are hereby levied against the lots and tracts specially benefited by the said improvements as set forth in the attached assessment roll for the district.

Section 8. All assessments and installment interest thereon may be paid in approximately twenty (20) equal annual installments. Annual installments are due and payable on or before the 30th day of November of each year, with the first such installment coming due and being payable on November 1, 19 98.

Section 9. Interest on the unpaid assessment shall be at the rate equal to the effective interest rate on the last bonds sold to finance similar improvements.

Section 10. Assessment installments not paid when due and payable are delinquent beginning on the day following the date when due and payable. A penalty of eight percent (8%) shall be added to any assessment installment not paid before the date of delinquency and both the penalty and the delinquent amount shall draw interest at the rate of eight percent (8%) per annum until paid.

Within thirty (30) days from the passage of Section 11. this resolution, the Municipal Treasurer shall mail, postage prepaid, a notice to any owner of property whose assessment, schedule of payments, delinquencies, or amount of penalty and interest has been changed as a result of the hearing on the Not more than sixty (60), or less than thirty assessment roll. said assessment or the the date before the Municipal installment thereof shall become delinquent, Treasurer shall mail a payment notice to each property owner, but failure to mail such notice shall in no way affect any liability for assessment levied by this resolution.

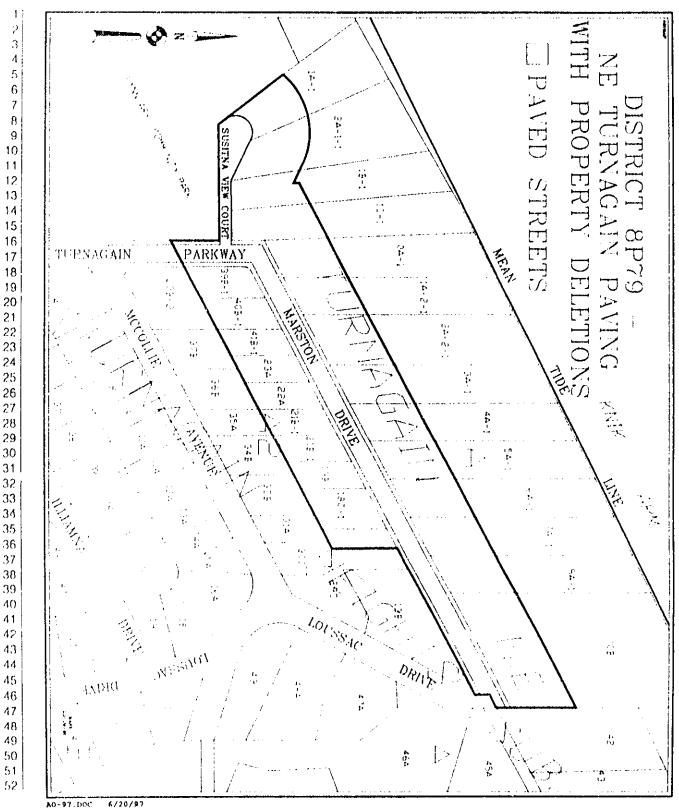

ORDINANCE ASSESSING DISTRICT 8P79 - NE TURNAGAIN PAVING AND

STREET LIGHTS.

Attached is a report from the Department of Public Works, describing the background and information concerning the assessment district for District 8P79 - NE Turnagain Paving and Street Lighting. When final assessments are levied, the standard practice is for the Assembly to adopt a resolution confirming a final assessment roll. The intent of the resolution is to establish final assessments in the manner prescribed in the original ordinance creating the district.

Since the street improvement district petition was submitted for creation in 1979, the original petition and project have changed. The changes that were added to the creation ordinance definition of the scope of the project include implementing a replat, conducting a soils study and adding street lights to the improvements being constructed. These improvements, and the method of how they are assessed, should be incorporated into the district in ordinance form. Also, the Assembly has made amendments to delete property from the assessment district and increase the assessable overhead costs above the standard 20%.

The attached ordinance amends and consolidates past approved ordinances and levies special assessments for District 8P79. The total assessable project cost is \$1,317,833.37 and is an accumulation of the following charges. The first group of costs are those that are generally assessed to all properties in the district, and the second group of costs are assessed only to those owners that voluntarily signed for them.

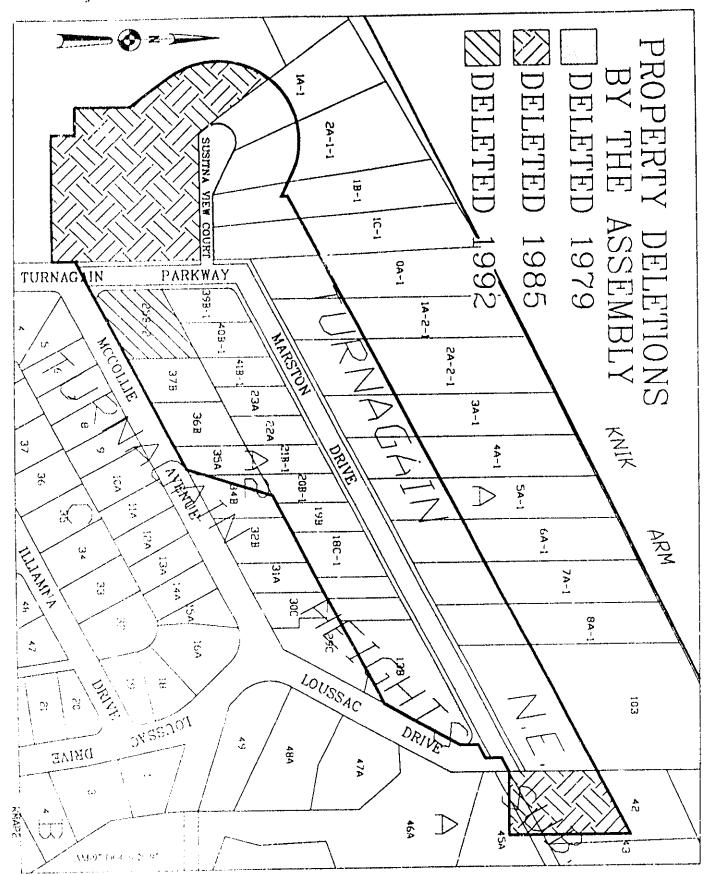

SUBJECT: BACKGROUND OF DISTRICT 8P79 - NORTHEAST TURNAGAIN PAVING AND STREET LIGHTS

On March 11, 1978 the Assembly approved AO 78-84, AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO DEVELOPMENT OF LAND WITHIN THE AREA KNOWN AS THE TURNAGAIN SLIDE AREA AND REPEALING AO 77-214 AND AO 77-400. This ordinance prohibited building on the land shown in Turnagain Area Map unless full standard streets and utilities were installed in the area. Because the land was already subdivided and under multiple ownership it was the assumption that the primary method to construct these improvements were by special assessment districts. On February 13, 1979, the Assembly created LID 101, for sanitary sewer, and on May 8, 1979, WID 307 was created for water improvements.

On November 13, 1979, a Public Hearing was conducted by the Assembly for proposed AO No. 79-193 concerning a petition to create Street Special Assessment District 8P79 to construct paved streets with rolled curbs and gutters in the Northeast Turnagain Area (1979 District Map). At the conclusion of the Public Hearing the Assembly approved amendments of the proposed Ordinance. The first amendment excluded lots from the RID that are above the bluff line and do not have access to the streets proposed for improvement. This amena - ant deleted Lots 13B, 34B, 35A, 36B, and 37B of Block A-2 of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision as property specially benefited by the assessment district. The second amendment deleted Lot 29C, Block A-2 of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision.

On February 26, 1985, the Municipal Assembly amended and approved AO No. 85-25 which provided at the Lyn Ary Park and Lots 42, 43, 44 and 45 of Tract A of the Turnagain Heights Subdivision be deleted as property specially benefited from the assessment district. This ordinance also provided that the assessable cost of the project be changed from the lesser amount of (1) contract costs plus twenty percent (20%) for non-contract costs or (2) the last approved estimate plus ten percent (10%), to the full cost of the improvements. The property owners were repetitioned for the project incorporating the new estimated costs and approved the petition.

On July 21, 1987 the Municipal Assembly amended and accepted AIM 209-87 to establish a geotechnical study and provided that the owners, by agreement, be required to reimburse the James P. Fero November 18, 1997 Page 2 of 3

Municipality the cost of the study, not to exceed \$100,000.

As of December 7, 1990, property owners approved a petition to continue with the district, which contained revised estimated costs based upon an actual bid to construct the project and the increased costs from the repiat and the soils study. The petition was a combined effort between the Anchorage Water and Waste Water Utility and Public Works. The petition statement was presented to allow the property owners to favor the project in its entirety, which included water improvement costs, sanitary sewer improvement costs and the street improvement costs. Each improvement proposal received approval of owners that represented over 50% of the cost and the repetition effort was sustained on an individual assessment district basis. Additionally, property owners who represented over fifty percent (50%) of the cost petitioned to have street lights included as an improvement with the residential streets.

On April 25, 1991, the plat of Turnagain NE (Plat Number 91-19) was filed with the District Recorder Owners representing twenty-four (24) of the lots in the street assessment district executed and signed the replat

On May 8, 1992, Lots 24B-1 and 25B-1, Block A-2, were replatted into Lot 25B-2, Block A-2, Turnagain NE and on September 15, 1992, the Assembly amended and approved AO No. 92-112 which deleted the lot from the District. The Property Deletion May shows the progression of deletions by the Assembly and Summary Roll states the cost impact.

On December 17, 1993, the final pay estimate for the project was executed between the contractor and the Department of Public Works. The final assessable cost, including the changes to the district for the replat and soils study is \$1,317,833.37.

Since the street improvement district petition was submitted for creation in 1979, the Assembly has changed the original petition and project by: (1) deleting property, including the Lyn Ary Park; (2) increasing the total assessable cost to include engineering and administration costs in excess of 20% of construction cost, (3) adding a replat to the project; (4) adding a soils study to the project; and (5) adding street lights to the street improvements (refer to Assessed Area Maps). To final assess the district, it is necessary to further amend the original ordinance creating the district. The amendments include adding (1) street lights, (2) the soils study as agreed by the signatory property owners, and (3) the replat signed by the owners, as authorized improvements in the district, and set forth an Assembly approved method to assess the improvements. To clarify the changes in the legal descriptions that have occurred since 1979, it is also desirable to add a chronological description of the change in the property and specify the property deleted versus the property remaining in the district.

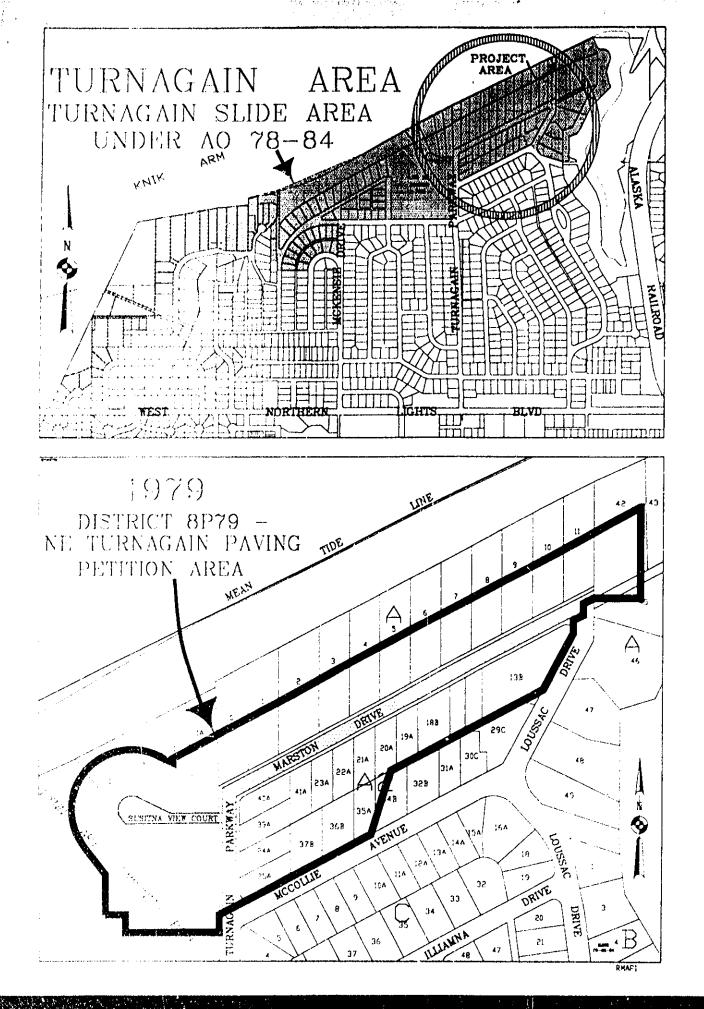
Of the unusual circumstances of this improvement district, the soils study and the replat were executed on a voluntary basis with certain owners. Only those owners wishing to participate signed the plat or an agreement for the soils study, and only those properties involved are proposed to be

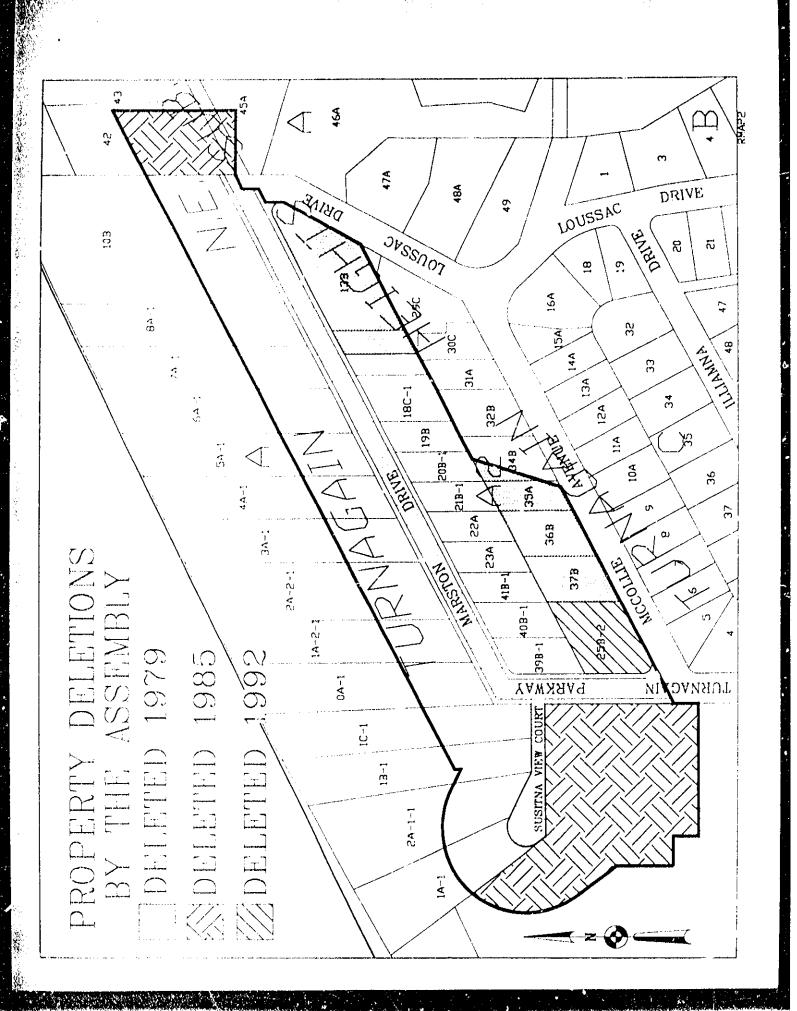

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assessed. Street lighting was established on a petition basis with owners that represented over 50% of the cost signing in favor. As to the street lights, as in the case of the street improvements, both owners for and opposed are being assessed for the improvements in a standard manner to other street improvement districts.

The engineering and administration costs and the remaining properties which absorb deleted assessments were approved by the Municipal Assembly under the ordinances described in this report. Further, with the exception of the deletion of Lot 25B-2, Block A-2, by AO 92-112 (when the project was substantially completed), on a petition basis, the cost impact involved was recirculated to the affected owners in which owners that represented over 50% of the proposed assessable cost approved to continue with the project.





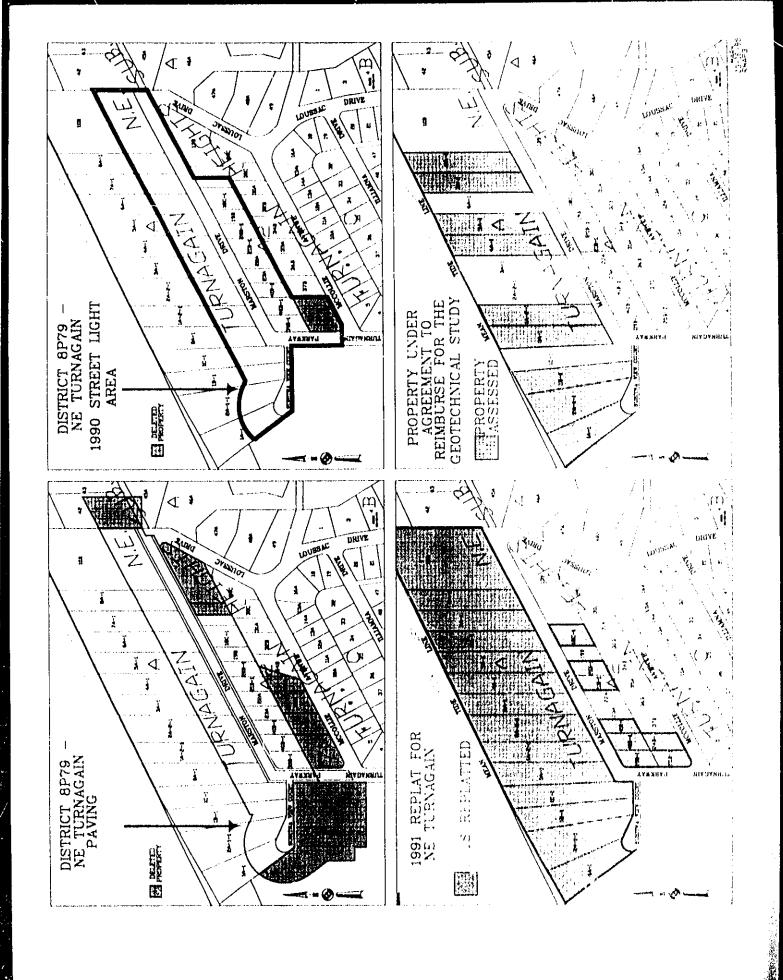

Submitted for Assembly action are two resolutions ordinance to levy assessments for the street and utility The assessment improvements in the Northeast Turnagain area. districts involved include Lateral Sewer Improvement District Improvement improvements; Water sewer 307, for water improvements; and Street Special sanitary Assessment District 8P79, assessing for a replat, a soils study, street improvements and street lights. These assessment districts were created by the Assembly in 1979, and prior to construction beginning in 1991, were amended by Assembly and The Assembly Memorandum for each Administrative action. assessment district describes the actions and changes involved.

The improvement district projects were completed in December 1993. Since then, the Department of Public Works and the Anchorage Water & Wastewater Utility, in cooperation with the Municipal Attorney's Office, have prepared the assessment rolls which incorporate past Assembly actions.

The sanitary sewer and water improvement assessment rolls are submitted in resolution form with respective memoranda to explain the sanitary sewer and water improvement districts' project histories, related Assembly actions, and utility staff recommendations to assure the districts' compliance with Municipal Code and Utility tariffs.

The street assessment district is submitted in ordinance form, which consolidates and includes Administrative and Assembly changes to the original assessment district created in 1979.

Attached is a COMBINED ROLL which consolidates all the project assessments on a per lot basis.

It is suggested that prior to the Public Hearing, an Assembly work session be scheduled to explain and discuss the background of this project and the basis for the recommendations.
