ORDINANCE NO. AO 98-6(S)

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED THIRTY-SIX MILLION SIX HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$36,600,000) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS OF EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 21, 1998.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage (the "Municipality") to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Six Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$36,600,000), for the purpose of paying the costs of planning designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within the Municipality including, but not limited to, the following:

Section 2. The sum of not to exceed Thirty-Six Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$36,600,000) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality for the

1 aforesaid school capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of
2 general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used for
3 capital improvements only. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the
4 payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all
5 taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount
6 to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due.

7 Section 3. An election is to be held on April 21, 1998, in and for the Municipality
8 of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the
9 qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must
10 receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be
11 approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

13 EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

14 Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$36,600,000 through the
15 issuance of general obligation bonds to pay costs of plan-
16 ning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation,
17 constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping
educational capital improvement projects within Anchorage
including, but not limited to, the following:

Voter approval of this bond proposition authorized for each \$100,000 of assessed real and personal property value (based on the estimated 1998 assessed valuation): (i) an annual increase in taxes of \$22.30 to retire the proposed

1 debt, and (ii) an increase in the tax cap limitation (Char-
2 ter 14.03(b)(2)) of \$1.10 to pay for \$141,350 of annual
3 operation and maintenance costs related to the proposed
4 educational capital improvements.

5 The debt will be paid from individual and business property
6 taxes levied and collected areawide in Anchorage. Anchor-
7 age will also pledge its full faith and credit for payment of the
8 debt.

9 THERE IS NO PROGRAM FOR STATE REIMBURSEMENT
10 TO ANCHORAGE FOR DEBT SERVICE ON THESE BONDS.
11 If legislation were enacted to establish such a program
12 Anchorage would seek reimbursement pursuant to the terms
13 of such legislation.

15 Section 4. The proposition, both for paper ballots and machine ballots, shall be
16 printed on a ballot which may set forth other general obligation bond propositions, and
17 the following words shall be added as appropriate and next to a square provided for
18 marking the ballot for voting by a machine:

21 Section 5. Section 2 of this Ordinance shall become effective only if the
22 proposition described in Section 3 is approved by a majority of the qualified voters voting
23 on the proposition at the regular election on April 21, 1998. The remaining sections of
24 this Ordinance shall become effective upon passage and approval.
