11	OF ANCHORAGE AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAY ASSOCIATED OPERATIONS
12	AND MAINTENANCE COSTS AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 21, 1998.
13	THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:
14	Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public
15	interest of the Municipality of Anchorage (the "Municipality") to incur general obligation
16	bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Thirty-Six Million Six Hundred
17	Thousand Dollars (\$36,600,000), for the purpose of paying the costs of planning,
18	designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating,
19	installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within the Municipality
20	including, but not limited to, the following:

 capital improvements only The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the
 payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all
 taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount
 to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due.

6 Section 3. An election is to be held on April 21, 1998, in and for the Municipality
7 of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the
8 qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection The proposition must
9 receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be
10 approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form.

EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$36,600,000 through the issuance of general obligation bonds and increase the municipal tax cap limitation by an amount up to \$141,350?

The general obligation bond proceeds will pay costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within Anchorage.
 The increase in the tax cap limitation will pay for operations and maintenance costs related to the proposed educational capital improvements. The proposed educational capital improvement projects include, but are not limited to, the following:
