AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR SUBMISSION TO THE QUALIFIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF INCREASING THE TAX INCREASE LIMITATION ["TAX CAP" IN CHARTER SECTION 14.03 (b) (2)] TO PAY FOR UP TO ONE HUNDRED FORTY-ONE THOUSAND THREE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$141,350) OF ANNUAL OPERATION AND MAINTENANCE COSTS FOR BAXTER, CREEKSIDE, AND OCEAN VIEW ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS PROPOSED BY THE 1998 GENERAL OBLIGATION BOND PROPOSITION

### THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY ORDAINS:

Section 1: It is hereby determined that the Municipality of Anchorage proposes to submit a proposition to the qualified voters of Anchorage at the April 21, 1998 election, the question of incurring general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed Thirty Six Million Six Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$36,600,000) for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within the Municipality including, but not limited to the following:
