A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY ACCEPTING THE MISSION,  
VISION, AND GOALS OF THE ANCHORAGE HEALTHY FUTURE PROJECT PLAN REPORT

Whereas, the purpose of the Anchorage Healthy Future Project (AHFP) is to improve the health and quality of life within the Municipality through collaboration among area residents, businesses, governments, agencies and organizations;

Whereas, the Health and Human Services Commission along with more than 1,000 Anchorage business leaders, public health officials, community activists, elected and appointed government officials, non profit services providers, members of the medical community, and concerned citizens participated in this project;

Whereas, the health of individuals and their communities are largely the product of our social environments, incomes, and the choices we make as individuals and as members of our communities;

Whereas, AHFP Plan Report provides guidance for the allocation of health and human services though the identification of the five priority areas which the residents of the community have identified as critically important to the future health of our community;

Whereas, two of the Municipal Health and Human Services Commission's primary responsibilities are to facilitate efficient and effective allocation of Anchorage's health and human service resources and provide advice to the Assembly;

Whereas, the Commission recommends the Assembly accept the AHFP Plan Report as a guide for the future health and social services resource allocation decisions; and

Whereas, this plan is now before the Assembly.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

Section 1. The mission, vision, and goals described in the Anchorage Healthy Future Project Plan Report are adopted as a guide for future health and social services development.

Section 2. That the Health and Human Services Commission along with other interested community members, will review and annually update the Assembly on progress towards completion and modification of the mission, visions and goals.

Section 3. That this resolution becomes effective upon approval by the Anchorage Assembly.
