A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY PROTESTING THE
RENEWAL OF A BEVERAGE DISPENSARY LIQUOR LICENSE AT 3230 OLD SEWARD
HIGHWAY, ANCHORAGE, ALASKA DBA THE CAPTAIN'S CLUB

The Anchorage Assembly finds that:

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly has received documentary
evidence pertaining to the proposed liquor license renewal; and

WHEREAS, the evidence presented to the Municipal Assembly has raised material,
serious, and substantial questions relating to the ability of the licensee to comply with local
and State laws in the operation of the establishment; and

WHEREAS, when the application to transfer the license to the current owners was
addressed, the Assembly questioned and was assured by the owners that the current ABC
laws were fully understood and that TAMS training for all staff would be undertaken; and

WHEREAS, between July 31, 1997 and September 15, 1997, the Captain's Club
had four bar violations and one incident reported in the Police Department's 3rd Quarter
report.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

Section 1: That for the reasons set forth above, the Municipality of Anchorage does
hereby protest the renewal of the beverage dispensary liquor license application for Demir
Redzepe and Chong Wick dba The Captain's Club, 3230 Old Seward Highway, Anchorage,
Alaska.

Section 2: The Municipal Attorney is requested to take appropriate steps to use any
document or evidence necessary to effectively advance the position of the Municipality at
any hearing before the State Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.
