## ANCHORAGE, ALASKA AR NO. 98- 19

A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY PROTESTING THE RENEWAL OF A BEVERAGE DISPENSARY LIQUOR LICENSE AT 515 W. 4 $^{\text{TH}}$  AVENUE, ANCHORAGE, ALASKA D/B/A THE 515 CLUB

The Anchorage Assembly finds that:

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly has received documentary evidence regarding liquor law violations pertaining to the proposed liquor license renewal; and

WHEREAS, the evidence presented to the Municipal Assembly has raised material, serious and substantial questions relating to the ability of the licensee to comply with local and state laws in operation of the establishment; and

WHEREAS, due to evidence of liquor law violations presented in 1996, the Assembly approved AR NO.-96-374 Amended, which set in place conditions for continued operation of the 515 Club in an effort to ensure the establishment would come into compliance with state and local laws and cease to be a threat to the health and safety of Anchorage residents; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.K of AR NO.-96-374 Amended, states that, "All patrons of the 515 Club will be checked at the door for identification and will be assessed as to age, manual dexterity and apparent sobriety."; and

WHEREAS, Section 1.K of AR NO.-96-374 Amended, was enacted to ensure that drunken persons would neither be served nor permitted on the licensed premise in violation of state and local news; and

 WHEREAS, evidence of liquor law violations for serving drunken persons on 7/13/97, 7/27/97, and 9/13/97 has been presented to the Assembly; and

 WHEREAS, if the conditions imposed in AR NO. 96-374 Amended had been adhered to as required, these events would not have taken place; and

WHEREAS, these continued liquor law violations constitute a pattern of practice which is injurious to the public health and safety; and

 WHEREAS, the documents provided prompted the Assembly to schedule this license renewal for public hearing on January 27, 1998; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly has found this documentary evidence to reflect major concerns and to be neither arbitrary nor capricious.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

<u>Section 1:</u> That the licensed premise D/B/A the 515 Club violated conditions of the license imposed by the Assembly in AR NO.-96-374 Amended.

Section 2: That for the reasons set forth above, the Municipality of Anchorage does hereby protest the renewal of the beverage dispensary liquor license application for Clark and Eddy, Inc. (Frank W. Hout and Paulette T. Hout), 515 W. 4th Avenue, Anchorage, Alaska.

Section 3: The Municipal Attorney is requested to take appropriate steps to use any document or evidence necessary to effectively advance the position of the Municipality at any hearing before the State Alcoholic Beverage Control Board.
