A RESOLUTION ENDORSING PROPOSED USES FOR THE REAPPROPRIATION OF THE SHIP CREEK WEIR AND TRAIL CROSSING GRANT AND REVISING THE 1998 LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, the Ship Creek Weir and Trail Crossing grant issued by the State of Alaska in 1996 is available for reappropriation of the unexpended and unencumbered balance due to cancellation of the project; and

WHEREAS, the Administration expects the 1998 State Legislature to reappropriate the unexpended and unencumbered balance of the Ship Creek Weir and Trail Crossing grant, in the approximate amount of \$943,000 (NINE HUNDRED FORTY THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS); and

WHEREAS, the Administration proposes alternate uses for the remaining balance of the Ship Creek Weir and Trail Crossing grant that are consistent with the intent to improve the Ship Creek area to make it more useful and attractive to residents and visitors of Anchorage, as reflected in the attached Assembly Memorandum; and

WHEREAS, the Assembly adopted the 1998 Legislative Program for the Municipality of Anchorage on November 18, 1997, per AR 97-277(S) as amended; and

WHEREAS, the 1998 Legislative Program should be revised to reflect the Municipality's proposed uses for the anticipated reappropriation of the remaining balance of the 1996 Ship Creek Weir and Trail Crossing grant.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY RESOLVES:

Section 1. That the proposed uses for the unexpended and unencumbered balance of the 1996 Ship Creek Weir and Trail Crossing grant as described in the attached Assembly Memorandum be forwarded to the State Legislature.

<u>Section 2.</u> That the 1998 Legislative Program is revised to include the proposed uses for reappropriated grant funds as described in the attached Assembly Memorandum.
