A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY APPROPRIATING FORTY THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$40,000) FROM THE ANCHORAGE METROPOLITAN POLICE SERVICE AREA FUND BALANCE (0151) TO NONDEPARTMENTAL TO BE USED AS A GRANT TO THE WOMEN POLICE OF ALASKA FOR THE 1998 INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF WOMEN POLICE TRAINING CONFERENCE

WHEREAS, the 1998 International Association of Women Police Training Conference will be held on October 26-30, 1998 at the Anchorage Hilton Hotel and the Egan Civic and Convention Center; and

WHEREAS, this training is intended to be of excellent quality with a variety of issues that will address audiences from first line officers to administrators; and

WHEREAS, it is anticipated that over 700 officers from around the World will attend this conference with participation from men and women officers from around the State who have assisted with preparations for the conference; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the costs for the conference will be covered by registration fees, but additional funding is necessary in order to meet the budgeted expenses.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

Section 1: That the sum of forty thousand dollars (\$40,000) is appropriated from the Anchorage Metropolitan Police Service Area Fund Balance (0151) to Nondepartmental to be used as a grant to the Women Police of Alaska for the 1988 International Association of Women Police Training Conference.

Section 2: That, if after final accounting has been done, the conference is able to demonstrate a profit, the Municipality shall be reimbursed to the fullest extent possible for this grant.

Section 3: That this resolution is effective immediately upon passage and approval
