A RESOLUTION OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE REVISING THE APPLICATION FOR MATCHING CAPITAL GRANT FUNDS THROUGH THE MUNICIPAL CAPITAL PROJECT MATCHING GRANT PROGRAM - AS 37.06 - FOR STATE FISCAL YEAR 1999

WHEREAS, the Municipality of Anchorage is eligible for a State FY 99 grant allocation under AS 37.06 as set forth in 2 AAC 47.030; and

WHEREAS, municipalities are required under AS 37.06.010(d) to submit a prioritized list of capital projects to the State Department of Administration; and

WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly endorsed and approved the original grant funding request for a prioritized list of capital projects per AR 97-217 as amended on September 23, 1997 and subsequently revised the prioritized list on February 28, 1998 per AR 98-38; and

WHEREAS, the Administration has proposed substituting the <u>project title only</u> for priority #4 on the Municipality's prioritized list of capital projects; and -

WHEREAS, all capital projects appearing on the Municipality of Anchorage list of projects meet the definition of "capital project" per AS 37.06.090; and

WHEREAS, the municipality is required under AS 37.060.030(a)(3) to provide a local matching share for capital projects funded through the Municipal Capital Project Matching Grant Program.

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Assembly resolves:

Section 1. That the Municipality of Anchorage, by this resolution, hereby endorses and requests grant funding under AS 37.06, for the revised list of capital projects per Attachment A of the accompanying Assembly Memorandum; and agrees to provide the local share for the projects as required under AS 37.06.

Assembly Resolution 98-147, Revising the Application for Matching Grant Funds Through the Municipal Capital Project Matching Grant Program - AS 37.06 for State Fiscal Year 1999

The Administration is proposing a revision to the FY 99 application for State capital matching grants, approved by the Assembly February 24, 1998. This revision proposes to substitute *South Anchorage Sports Fields* for *East Anchorage Ballfields* as priority #4. This proposed revision affects only the project title; the state grant request and local share remain unchanged (See Attachment A).

Currently, the Municipality does not have adequate funding to construct either the South Anchorage Sports Fields or the East Anchorage ballfields. The Administration believes that focusing all available funding sources on the completion of the South Anchorage Sports Fields is the most effective use of the bond and grant dollars that are "in-hand". In 1995 and 1991 voters approved a significant amount of funding to design and eventually construct sports fields in Anchorage. Although voters narrowly disapproved the 1998 Parks & Rec bond, the bond ballot asked the question of whether to construct sports fields at multiple sites. Given the results of the 1998 park bond election as well as prior year bond elections, it appears that the most effective use of limited bond/grant dollars would be to focus on constructing the South Anchorage Sports Fields and to postpone development of the East Anchorage Ballfields.

The main reason for choosing the South Anchorage Sports Fields over the East Anchorage Ballfields is that the majority of funds "in-hand" are *directed* to be used in "South Anchorage", which has been defined through Assembly Resolution as any area south of Dimond Boulevard. Other reasons why the South Anchorage Sports Fields *should* proceed ahead of the East Anchorage Ballfields include:

- The need for sports facilities in South Anchorage has long been known and the Municipality has been working to address the need for sports facilities in South Anchorage for many years.
- The South Anchorage Sports Fields project is further along in the design process and is more on-schedule for construction than the East Anchorage ballfields project which must work through wetlands issues.
- The South Anchorage Sports Fields project will offer a greater variety of sporting opportunities to a large number of users.

The Governor's Capital Budget has already been submitted to the Alaska Legislature for appropriation of funds. Therefore, the revised list of prioritized projects for the Municipality must be provided directly to the State Office of Management & Budget and to the

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Legislature for their consideration.
