## 123456789 A RESOLUTION OF THE ANCHORAGE MUNICIPAL ASSEMBLY SUPPORTING THE ALASKA 10 CHALLENGER LEARNING CENTER FOR SPACE SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY 11

13 WHEREAS, the Alaska Challenger Learning Center for Space Science and Technology in Kenai is part 14 of a growing network of centers nationwide established in memory of the crew of the ill-fated 1986 Challenger 15 Space Shuttle: with the national Challenger organization established by the families of the seven crew members 16 to continue the crew's educational mission: and 17

18 WHEREAS, the Alaska Challenger Learning Center will offer a unique hands-on experience designed 19 to get Alaskan students enthused about science, math, and technology; with students working as engineers and scientists on simulated space missions, developing their decision-making and communication skills by solving 20 21 problems; and

22 23 WHEREAS, the core of the Center is the interactive computerized simulator - a space lab ready for 24 exploration and a mission control room patterned after the Johnson Space Center - with accommodations for up 25 to forty active participants per mission: and 26

27 WHEREAS, whether students are navigating a lunar landing, chasing a comet's tail, or voyaging to Mars, 28 each mission scenario will foster interest in math, science, and technology while helping young people recognize 29 the importance of key life-skills; and 30

31 WHEREAS, this project will be financed by corporate, State and Federal funds, and individual donations, 32 with an estimated \$750,000 required for the equipment and licensing fees, and a total of \$5 million needed to 33 complete the project. 34

NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves:

That the Assembly supports the construction and operation of the Alaska Challenger Section 1: Learning Center for Space Science and Technology.

That the Assembly thanks Kenai Mayor John Williams, Kenai Council Members, the Section 2: initial Steering Committee, and current Board Members and Project Coordinator for their efforts in bringing a Challenger Learning Center to Alaska.

That, though this is a State-wide project, the Assembly realizes the tremendous Section 3: educational opportunity this Center will provide to Anchorage students, and the Assembly encourages Anchorage citizens to actively participate in local fund-raising efforts and promotional events.
