Submitted by: Chairman of the Assembly at the 5 CLERK'S OFFICE **APPROVED** 6 Request of the Mayor Date: 11-17-98 Prepared by: **Executive Manager's Office** For Reading: 8 November 17, 1998 9 10 ANCHORAGE, ALASKA 11 **AR** 98–365 12 A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING GUIDELINES & CRITERIA TO BE USED IN 13 **DEVELOPING THE 1999 LEGISLATIVE PROGRAM** 14 15 WHEREAS, the Anchorage Assembly and the Mayor wish to continue to develop 16 17 a strong working relationship with both the Legislature and the Governor to emphasize issues of concern to Anchorage which carry local, regional, or 18 statewide significance. 19 20 WHEREAS, the State must deal with revenues declining over time, while 21 22 meeting the challenge of reducing the cost of State government through rational 23 and equitable means; and 24 WHEREAS, there continues to be a backlog of deferred maintenance of public 25 facilities throughout the State; and 26 27 WHEREAS, in these times of depressed State revenues, government should 28 29 focus on the least costly, most efficient means of providing public services; and 30 WHEREAS, Anchorage represents 41.6% of the State's population and serves 31 as a regional and statewide center for health care, social services, and cultural 32 33 and recreational services; and 34 WHEREAS, Safe Communities (Municipal Assistance) and State Revenue 35 Sharing to Anchorage have been cut by 69% overall since 1986; and 36 37 WHEREAS, restructuring of regulated, basic service industries, such as electric 38 39 and refuse collection, is a highly complex issue that deserves detailed, careful and informed decision making; and 40 41 WHEREAS, Alaska's fishing industry is facing problems which jeopardize its 42 economic value and the thousands of jobs it supports, and 43 44 WHEREAS, the Mayor and the Anchorage Municipal Assembly are beginning 45 46 the process of developing a 1999 Legislative Program. 47 48 NOW, THEREFORE, the Anchorage Municipal Assembly resolves that the following guidelines and criteria be used in developing the 1999 Legislative 49 Program: 50

Section 1. Legislative Issues—

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- (a) The Municipality supports continued efforts to address the deferred maintenance and unmet capital needs of public facilities and infrastructure in the State.
- (b) The Municipality intends to continue its emphasis on legislation that will allow the Municipality and State to more effectively deal with crime in Anchorage.
- (c) The Municipality intends to propose a variety of changes to clarify and refine existing Alaska Statutes in order to enhance the ability of local government to operate more effectively.
- (d) The Municipality supports legislation to provide local government with adequate State funding of mandated programs/services or to provide a local option for participation in the program/services.
- (e) The Municipality is opposed to any new State taxes that unfairly impact Anchorage.
- (f) The Municipality does not oppose refuse collection restructuring provided it is structured so that ratepayers and taxpayers are protected from monopolistic price fixing, cross-subsidization, and loss of value of the taxpayers' investment.
- (g) The Municipality intends to continue working with the Alaska Public Utilities Commission and the Legislature in the multitude of issues involved with the restructuring of the electric industry.
- (h) The Municipality urges the legislature to address the problems facing the fishing industry, such as the recent disastrous salmon runs, and work toward protecting the economic viability and the thousands of jobs it supports.
- (i) The Municipality intends to oppose any new legislation that impairs the ability of local government to operate effectively and efficiently.

Section 2. Operating Budget --

- (a) The Municipality encourages fair and equitable treatment with regard to any State FY 2000 funding decisions.
- (b) The Municipality opposes transfers of responsibilities or mandates without adequate funding.
- (c) The Municipality strongly urges the Legislature to maintain funding for the Human Services Matching Grant Program at the FY 1999 level.

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
