ORDINANCE NO. AO 99-17

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING FOR THE SUBMISSION TO THE QUALI-FIED VOTERS OF ANCHORAGE, ALASKA, THE QUESTION OF THE ISSUANCE OF NOT TO EXCEED ONE HUNDRED TWENTY-ONE MILLION FIVE HUNDRED SEVENTY THOUSAND FOUR HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$121,570,400) OF GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS OF THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE TO PAY THE COSTS EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENTS IN THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE AND THE QUESTION OF AN INCREASE IN THE MUNICIPAL TAX CAP LIMITATION TO PAY ASSOCIATED OPERATIONS AND MAINTENANCE COSTS AT AN ELECTION IN AND FOR THE MUNICIPALITY OF ANCHORAGE ON APRIL 20, 1999.

THE ANCHORAGE ASSEMBLY HEREBY ORDAINS:

Section 1. It is hereby determined to be for a public purpose and in the public interest of the Municipality of Anchorage (the "Municipality") to incur general obligation bonded indebtedness in an amount not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-One Million Five Hundred Seventy Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$121,570,400) for the purpose of paying the costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within the Municipality which include, but are not limited to, the projects listed below. The use of proceeds of the aforementioned bonds to finance the costs of projects listed in the table under "Reimbursement Projects" will occur only if, and to the extent that, such projects qualify for at least 70% debt service reimbursement under Alaska Statutes 14.11.100, as the same may be amended from time to time.

Seventy Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$121,570,400) shall be borrowed by, for and on behalf of the Municipality for the aforesaid school capital improvements and shall be evidenced by the issuance of general obligation bonds of the Municipality. The bond proceeds shall be used only for capital improvements and costs of issuance of the bonds. The full faith and credit of the Municipality is pledged for the payment of the principal of and interest on the bonds, and ad valorem taxes upon all taxable property in the Municipality shall be levied without limitation as to rate or amount to pay the principal of and interest on the bonds when due.

<u>Section 3</u>. An election is to be held on April 20, 1999, in and for the Municipality of Anchorage, for the purpose of submitting a general obligation bond proposition to the qualified voters of the Municipality for approval or rejection. The proposition must receive a majority vote of those in the Municipality voting on the question to be approved. The proposition shall be substantially in the following form:

SUMMARY

This bond proposition authorizes Anchorage to issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$121,570,400 for educational capital improvements. Voter authorization permits Anchorage to issue general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$121,570,400. Approval of this bond proposition also permits Anchorage to raise the Municipal Tax Cap to pay for operations and maintenance costs related to the educational capital improvement projects.

Anchorage will issue bonds to finance the "Reimbursement Projects" as shown in the ballot proposition below under the State of Alaska's program for debt reimbursement which provides for payment of 70% of the principal and interest on the bonds issued. Actual payment for debt reimbursement from the State of Alaska is subject to annual legislative appropriations.

PROPOSITION NO.

EDUCATIONAL CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT BONDS

Shall Anchorage borrow up to \$121,570,400 through the issuance of general obligation bonds and increase the municipal tax cap by an amount up to \$104,650 to pay for associated annual operations and maintenance costs?

The general obligation bond proceeds will pay costs of planning, designing, acquiring property for, site preparation, constructing, acquiring, renovating, installing and equipping educational capital improvement projects within Anchorage. The increase in the municipal tax cap will pay for operations and maintenance costs related to the proposed educational capital improvements.

The proposed educational capital improvement projects which include, but are not limited to, the following:
